(t) Discipline and Law Enforcement Regulations Instruction Manual

1. Situation. Per the references, to promulgate the discipline and law enforcement regulations for the Combat Center.

2. Cancellation. CCO 1630.6A and CCO 5512.4A.

3. Mission. To implement references (a) through (t), and to define, clarify, and establish local policies and procedures relative to the discipline and law enforcement aboard the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC). Reference (t) is to be followed by Commanding Officers (COs), Assistant Chiefs of Staff (ACs/S), Special Staff Officers, Officers-in-Charge (OIC), personnel, and residents aboard the Combat Center.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. This Order and reference (t) should be reviewed in their entirety by all personnel aboard the Combat Center.

(2) Concept of Operations. Combat Center Orders establish responsibilities and procedures which govern the conduct of personnel and activities aboard the Combat Center. These regulations are a general order and punitive in nature, and any violation may result in disciplinary or punitive proceedings.

b. Subordinate Element Missions

(1) COs, ACs/S, Special Staff Officers, and OICs. Ensure that all personnel and associated command specific elements are familiar with this Order.

(2) AC/S G-7

(a) Responsible for establishing local instructions for the discipline and law enforcement aboard MAGTF/TC, MCAGCC.

(b) Ensure reference (t) is reviewed annually, complies with higher level directives contained in the references, and is available for units to utilize.


