# 8th Marines display **MAGTF's capabilities**

The 8th Marine Regiment demonstrated its capabilities as the command element of the Marine Air-Ground Task Force during Integrated Training Exercise 1-16 aboard the Combat Center, Oct. 23-Nov. 15.

Formerly known as the Combined Arms Exercise, ITX is now one of the largest training exercises Marine Corps units participate in prior to deployment. Approximately 4,000 Marines and Sailors from II Marine Expeditionary Force encompassing the MAGTF participated in ITX 1-16.

"One of the goals of ITX is to bring all the elements of the MAGTF together: the command element, logistics combat element, ground combat element, and your aviation combat element," said the Commanding Officer

of 8th Marine Regiment, Col. Martin Wetterauer III. "Often, the first time we get to train as a MAGTF is out here at ITX."

The training at ITX centered on integrating the different abilities of the MAGTF together to create an effective, well-coordinated fighting force. Units gained proficiency in that integration starting at the squad level all the way to the final culminating event which was the Battalion Assault Course.

ITX not only tested the individual units but the command and control capabilities of 8th Marine Regiment.

"The intent of ITX is to focus on 8th Marine Regiment's core and core plus missions. For a regiment, we come out here with roughly 11 [training and readiness standards] that we train to," Wetterauer explained.

# No holiday for safety

The holiday season is time for Marines and sailors to enjoy their well-deserved time off celebrating alongside friends and family. During this extended period of liberty, it is important for service members to be mindful of the dangers and risks that go along with it and to ensure that safety doesn't take a holiday.

According to the Provost Marshal's Accident Investigation Division, a significant rise in traffic accidents and collisions on-base has been noticed over the past year due to distracted drivers and driver's paying less attention to their surroundings.

"Driver distraction is the leading factor in traffic accidents," said Capt. Benjamin Gutek, Operations Officer, Provost Marshal's Office. "To be a safe driver involves clear judgment, concentration, and time to react. While traveling to or from work, be aware of your surroundings, eliminate distractions by getting organized before you depart and keep in mind the faster you travel the more following or stopping

distance you'll need."

In research AID conducted, drivers who make one claim, end up paying an average of 41 percent more for car insurance. It is not just safer to pay more attention to one's surrounding while operating a vehicle; it is also going to equal to substantial savings on increased insurance costs.

According to the Combat Center Safety Division, fatigued driving and drunk driving are also among some of the most prominent dangers that Marines and sailors face during the holiday season. Before going on liberty, planning ahead can make the difference in a potentially dangerous situation.

"Marines tend to have most issues with fatigue driving when they are returning from the liberty period," said Bob Piirainen, traffic safety program manager, Combat Center Safety Division. "It's important to get rest before driving and if necessary, to spend a little extra money on a hotel room to ensure you are rested for the drive back to base. Before you begin drinking ensure you have a designated driver and have an Arrive Alive Card. Utilizing the buddy

everything from forming a command operations center, to conducting logistics, conducting fire support planning, offensive operations, defensive operations, and conducting reconnaissance."

An added layer of training that ITX provides is the effect of the physical environment. "For Marines coming from Lejeune, the desert environment is significantly different than the Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, environment that we've been training in," Wetterauer said. "[Being in Twentynine Palms] takes the Marine from the current training level he was proficient at before we left, he comes out here and we add another layer of problem to it,

another layer of complexity, and now he has to go through that to be successful."

Most importantly, ITX is serving as a training exercise for 8th Marine Regiment for when they assume the command element role of Special Purpose Marine Air-Ground Task Force-Crisis Response-Africa 16.1.

"All the elements that will deploy with the SPMAGTF 16.1 Crisis Response Africa mission are out here conducting ITX. So we are now getting to practice how we will deploy in a few months," Wetterauer said.

Following ITX, SPMAGTF-CR-AF 16.1 will move directly into their certification exercise with the

majority of the command element remaining in California while forward elements will move to the east coast to simulate the geographical distances the unit will have to overcome while deployed.

"We will now move into the missions that are assigned to us as a SPMAGTF, which are embassy reinforcement, non-combatant evacuation operations and quick reaction force," said Wetterauer.

Wetterauer reiterated that conducting operations in this format is the way ahead for the 8th Marine Regiment and the Marine Corps as whole. "The MAGTF is the basis for how the Marine Corps fights and conducts operations overseas," Wetterauer said.

tool for voting registration and knowledge on voting requirements for each service member's home state.

"The website is very easy to utilize," Chaves said. "Sending your vote home is as simple as filling out a federal post-card application, which is a request for a write-in ballot. When election time comes, [FVAP] will mail you a write-in absentee ballot."

According to Chaves, using mail-in ballots is the most popular choice for service members to vote in elections according to their legal residence. "You can print the post card application, the write-in absentee ballot, and an envelope that will have pre-printed postage, so you won't have to

"If you wanted to go to the polls, you would have to go back home to do it, which is why most service members use absentee ballots," added Chaves.

FVAP recommends registering annually, in order to ensure an updated residential address.

"As a citizen, voting is your duty," Chaves said. "Do your research and study the candidates so you can make an informed decision based off of your ideals and what you stand for."

system and appointing a designated driver can help to mitigate those risks."

The Combat Center Safety Division hosts classes such as the Defensive Driving Course Alive at 25 to help improve Marines' driving habits. In addition, these courses serve to inform Marines of the repercussions of their actions to ensure that they understand how their conduct can affect their careers.

"Think about the consequences before you act," Piirainen said. "Every year during these longer holidays it comes with a rise in [driving under the influence] and other incidents. One bad decision can end your career."

# Jet arrives for "Sling Shot" trails

Another chapter of Aviation History was written Nov. 28 when a marine super-sonic jet fighter (F4D Skyray) landed and refueled at the Short Airfield for Tactical Support (SATS) that has been undergoing planning, construction and testing here for the last several months.

Capt. Jimmy L. Pappas, test pilot for the SATS project and the Air Field Operations Officer landed his jet aircraft with needle point precision, and will prepare to take off early tomorrow. The concept of the air field enabled Capt. Pappas and his high powered jet to land is similar to an aircraft carrier. That is, it has a "sling" type arresting gear.

The jet aircraft came in on its approach and caught onto a cable that was strung across the runway. Each end of this cable is in turn is connected to nylon tape which is wound around wheels which play out the tape as the aircraft engages the cable.

It enabled the jet to come in at approach speed of better than 160 knots and to be brought to complete rest within 700 feet, instead of the Air Base Squadron No. 37, 3rd Marine Aircraft thousands of yards usually consumed.

The aircraft will be "slung" in the air and be completely air borne within 1,000 feet. The fact that the jets can be effectively and rapidly landed, refueled, armed, and launched was proven yesterday. This concept is not only possible, but very practical. The theory that was proven fact yesterday at t eh world's largest Marine Corps Base means that the long, time consuming task of constructing the "old style" runway is now no longer necessary. In the past, it took engineers weeks and weeks if round-the-clock construction to prepare a single landing strip capable of handling jet aircraft. Yesterday these weeks were cut down to hours, thus enabling a team of engineers to set up a Short Airfield for Tactical Support quickly to handle the jets that support today's fast Marine infantry units.

The SATS construction project here started in mid-September. Sub Unit No. 2 from Marine

Wing was established and sent to our Base with components of their supply, communications, motor transport, air control, crash crew, maintenance, and administrative sections. These men have been doing their jobs in the field and living here on Base since the Sub Unit's formation in September.

Actual engineering construction of the field was accomplished by the men on the Navy Mobile Construction Battalion from Port Hueneme.

The Base SATS site is the only airfield of its type capable of arresting and catapulting jet aircraft built from scratch. What was previously a patch of barren desert land 13 miles from the main area of the Base is now a teeming, busy, semi-permanent air field, capable of handling any number of jet fighter type aircraft. It will be complete with all air traffic control services, weather instruments, refueling apparatus, and all the facilities needed to coordinate a tactical jet airfield early in 1963.



"We were just issued the new M252A2 Lightweight 81 mm mortar system and before we employed it in combat, we decided to get the Marines out here [Al Asad range] and get some live fires training with the system," said U.S. Marine 1st Lt. Alex Sherrod, the executive officer with Weapons Company.

During the training, Marines familiarized themfunctions of the system they could possibly employ in the battle space as a protection measure. The primary benefit of the training is it allowed the Marines the opportunity to hone their tactics, techniques and procedures in employment of the weapons system, further reinforcing their ability to provide protection to their coalition and Iraqi partners.

The new system is overall 10 pounds lighter than the previous mortar system and has heat reducing technology to keep the weapons system cooler than its predecessor.

The Marines fired a total of 87 rounds during the ensure every mortar team received ample time with the new system.

"It's a pretty cool opportunity to come out here and train," said U.S. Marine Cpl. Destry Stemme, a squad leader with Weapons Company. "It has definitely been a learning experience for me and the other Marines, and this additional training allows us to be more effective on the battlefield."

CJTF-OIR is a coalition of regional and international nations who have joined together to defeat the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant and the threat they pose to Iraq, Syria, the region and the wider international community.

# Recent change to PMO access control policy

The Provost Marshall's Office released a policy regarding access control and registration of vehicles aboard the Combat Center effective Nov. 9.

In the past, the Combat Center utilized Department of Defense decals on vehicles to ensure individuals could receive access to the installation. The new policy regarding access control resulted in decals no longer being a recognized form of access control. Valid identification cards, such as a Common Access Card or Teslin, are now required to be presented and

inspected to allow access for any individual.


"They previously allowed access to installations with the DoD decal," said Gunnery Sgt. James A. Meak, physical security chief, PMO. "Before, we required that personnel be vetted through the vehicle registration office; now, if you're a military member with a valid [military] ID, you're allowed to come aboard the installation and go about freely without a visitor pass."

According to Meak, this new procedure creates a streamlined process at the entrance gates while still ensuring everything is conducted in accor-

dance with security requirements. Permanent residents must still register their vehicles upon arrival to the installation.

"For Marines [and civilians] stationed here, we still require them to register their vehicles aboard the installation," Meak said. "This gives us a snapshot of what we have and allows us to identify vehicles a lot easier versus running their license plates."





ovember 2015 marks the 72nd anniversary of the Battle of Tarawa. Tarawa was the first Marine attack in the central Pacific region during World War II and is remembered as one of the fiercest engagements of the campaign.

The battle raged from Nov. 20-23, 1943, on the Tarawa Atoll in the Gilbert Islands. An atoll is a coral reef that breaches the surface of the ocean and forms an island.

It became necessary for the Marines to capture Tarawa following the fighting of Guadalcanal. The island, roughly the size of Central Park in Manhattan, N.Y., served as the site of the first American offensive in the central Pacific region.

The Battle of Tarawa was one of the most tenacious and bloodiest battles in Marine Corps History. Nearly 6,400 Japanese, Korean and U.S. service members died in the three-day battle.

An American force of 17 aircraft carriers, 12 battleships, 8 heavy cruisers, 4 light cruisers, 66 destroyers and 36 transport ships moved to the Gilbert Islands Nov. 20. This was the largest force assembled in the Pacific for a single operation.

When the U.S. force approached Tarawa, Japanese forces opened fire with artillery batteries. The Americans responded with a counter battery that neutralized a majority of the Japanese artillery.

The Marines approached the shore using small amphibious vehicles to reach the beach at low tide, forcing the infantry to wade through waist deep water to reach dry land. Enemy machine gun fire rained down on the men from the shore. The Marines who made it ashore secured the beach and waited for reinforcements.

On the morning of Nov. 21, tanks and artillery were brought by boat allowing the Marines to advance on the Japanese entrenched inland. U.S. forces captured the majority of the island on this day.

Marines pursued the remaining Japanese forces and an airstrip held by the enemy Nov. 22. By the evening, the remaining Japanese forces were either pushed back into the tiny amount of land to the east of the airstrip, or operating in several isolated pockets around the island.

When the fighting was finished only 17 Japanese soldiers survived out of the 4,700 who fought. Nearly 1,700 U.S. service members were killed and 2,101 were wounded.

"The capture of Tarawa knocked down the front door to the Japanese in the Central Pacific," said Adm. Chester Nimitz, the commander-in-chief of U.S. Pacific Fleet during World

The legacy of Tarawa lives on in the Marine odds but persevered until victorious.





# **Bond is Back!**

'Spectre' double-O dazzles with derring-do, action & emotional depth

"Spectre" Starring Daniel Craig, Christoph Waltz and Lèa Seydoux Directed by Sam Mendes Rated PG-13

James Bond, with his iconic "license to kill," has never been a stranger to death. And in Spectre, the latest adventure of the world's most famous secret agent, the prospect of mortality looms especially large. "The dead are alive," a cryptic sentence, is the very first thing you see on the screen, just before the face of a gigantic skeleton in a Day of the Dead parade.

But as Bond (Daniel Craig) notes at one point, "Death and dying—it's all a matter of perspective." Spectre, the 24th movie since Dr. No began the Bond franchise in 1962, may reflect on the past and even gaze into the grave, but it's vibrantly, expressively, emotionally alive and very much in step with today. Reuniting Craig with director Sam Mendes—his partner in the snap, crackle and pop of Skyfall in 2012—it begins with Bond going off the grid to wrap up some unfinished business just as the "double-O" espionage program headed by his boss, M (Ralph Fiennes), is in danger of being scrapped back in London.

A crusading young British intelligence officer, C (Andrew Scott, Moriarty on TV's Sherlock), wants to replace Bond and his "prehistoric" stalk-and-shoot derring-do with a new multi-national initiative, using global surveillance and drones to keep track of criminals—as well as everyone else.

"It's the future," C tells M. "And you're not."

M smells a big, worldwide rat, and so does Bond and off he goes to track it down, to Mexico, Rome, Austria and the desert of North Africa, setting up some thrilling set pieces that up the ante on cinematic Bond moments. A dazzling 15-minute beaut of an opener begins as one ludicrously long, unbroken tracking shot (filmed by a drone!) down a street and into an alley, up and out of an elevator, into a hotel room, through a window and onto a rooftopbefore climaxing in a building-toppling explosion, a frantic foot chase and a brutal hand-to-hand fight in an out-of-control helicopter dipping and diving over a crowded plaza filled with thousands of people.

There's a sleek nighttime car chase, an alpine pursuit with an airplane that becomes both a bobsled and a battering ram, and a brawl in a train so slambang intense you expect it to cause a derailment.

Christoph Waltz plays a nefarious über-villain with a deep-rooted evil secret that haunts-and hurts—Bond in more ways that one. Former pro wrestler Dave Bautista (so memorable as the red-tattooed Drax in Guardians of the Galaxy) is a hulking wall of sneering, leering bad news—and only one teeny, tiny two-word line of dialogue.

As the latest "Bond girl," French actress Lèa Seydoux gives Bond pause for something "more important" than the sometime-vicious necessities of his job. Ben Whitslaw returns as nerdy gadget master Q, and Naomie Harris is back as Moneypenny, the office assistant who's now become an invaluable assignment aide.

Will this, Craig's fourth outing as James Bond, be his last, as rumored? Time will tell. Other spies come and go, but Bond—whoever portrays him—has been the standard for more than 50 years, and Spectre finds him in fine, full, clever, super-stylish, ultra-cool, death-dodging form, very much alive and well.

"It's good to have you back, 007," M tells him at one point, welcoming him home. Yes, it bloody well double-O is!




