The Combat Center is the largest Marine Corps base in the world and is home to the Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command. The installation's mission is to conduct relevant live-fire combined arms training, urban operations and joint/coalition-level integration training that promote operational forces' readiness.

The Chief of Naval Operations, Adm. John Richardson, and the 37th Commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. Robert B. Neller, visited the installation to observe its many functions Tuesday and Wednesday.

On the first day of their visit, Richardson and Neller were welcomed by Maj. Gen. Lewis A. Craparotta, Combat Center Commanding General, Navy Capt. John A. Lamberton, commanding officer, Robert E. Bush Naval Hospital Twentynine Palms, and Sgt. Maj. Michael J. Hendges, Combat Center Sergeant Major, at the Strategic Expeditionary Landing Field. That evening, both Richardson and Neller attended a reception hosted by Craparotta at the Frontline Restaurant. Prior to the reception, Richardson stopped by the Combat Center's base theater to commend the sailors for their hard work and dedication as well as to answer ques-

"I believe this is the first time a CNO has ever visited the Combat Center," Richardson said. "You sail-

The Combat Center's Government and External Affairs, G5, facilitated a tour of the installation for members of Business Executives for National Security May 19.

BENS is an organization comprised of senior American business leaders who contribute their expertise and talent to support the U.S. Government and the Department of Defense to enhance national security efforts. According to Sidney Talley, director for national and internal programs, BENS, the tour gave the representatives an opportunity to learn about the different aspects of the installation while simultaneously learning how the Marines train and perform their daily duties.

Marine Aviation Marks 48th Year

Forty-eight years ago, on May 22, 1912 Marine Corps aviation was born when 1st Lt. Alfred A. Cunningham reported to the U.S. Naval Academy for "duty connected with flying."

Marine aviation has come a long way since the day of the clumsy, slow moving biplane. Today the skies over this desert Base are traveled by the Corps newest innovation, the helicopter. This modern

day aircraft is capable of performing feats that even the Wright brothers never dreamed possible.

When the United States entered World War I, Marine Corps aviation consisted of six officers, one warrant officer and forty-three enlisted men.

On Armistice Day the Marine Corps had a total of 282 officers and 2,180 enlisted men. By June of 1920 there were less than 1,000 Marines on active aviation duty. This figure

was not to rise above 1,500 for 20 years following the War.

The peak number of Marine aviation units was reached on September 30, 1944, when the Corps had a total of five air wings, thirty-one aircraft groups and 145 aircraft squadrons. The personnel peak was reached January 31, 1945 when 125,163 Marines were serving in aviation.


Today Marine aviation follows two separate but parallel lines, fixed

wing and rotary wing aircraft. In the fixed wing line the "Wildcats," "Hellcats," and "Corsairs" of only a few years ago have been replaced by "Furies," "Skyhawks," "Crusaders" and "Skyrays." Marine pilots now have capabilities of delivering atomic weapons with their aircraft. Helicopters are constantly being improved. New observation type 'Copters as well as huge transports are used by the Corps.

Montambo used to play for an Olympic soccer development team to travel all over Europe while doing what he loved.

>**I was born in Chesapeake, Va.** It's primarily where I grew up and went to high school.

>**I always played hockey and soccer** growing up, but in high school I had to choose a sport to dedicate my time to. I chose soccer, because I could improve myself without having to leave my family to live with my cousins where I could succeed in hockey.

>**My father is an engineer** for the Navy and has done that for the past 25 years.

>**During my senior year** of high school he got stationed in Italy. While in Italy, I joined an Olympic soccer development team and was able to travel all over Europe. Some of the places I played in were Germany and Holland.

>**Being able to see how other people lived** changed my perspective on things. I realized how easy we have things in this country. In some places, getting things like water or food is much more complicated than it is here.

>**My brother is also a Marine. He and I** both chose to go the officer route. We have a good relationship and I appreciate that I can ask him what he thinks about some of my decisions as an officer.

>**It's important to unwind** when you're not in uniform. I help organize the intermural soccer team



to relieve stress. I also encourage the officers and enlisted guys from my squadron to play golf on the weekends.

>**The biggest thing I have learned** is to stay humble. I am a captain, but I do not always have all the answers. There have been plenty of times when I have had to ask my sergeants to help me out.

>**It's never about you** when it comes to being a leader. Even though I may be the one flying, it is about making the life's of my Marines better.

>**I am here for the Integrated Training Exercise** and I am excited to be here. The Combat Center has the largest and best training area I have ever seen.



Marine Regiment and 2nd Battalion, 8th Marine Regiment, participating in Integrated Training Exercise 3-16 at Ranges 400 and 220. ITX is a 29-day exercise comprised of an intensive training cycle that evaluates the ability and adaptability of a Marine Air Ground Task Force consisting of approximately 4,000 Marines and sailors.

Neller has said that the Marine Corps must be maintained as a force in readiness, to include the ability of Marines to remain forward deployed, ready to fight and win. The readiness of a force is tied closely with its people and their training.

Following their visit to the Combat Center, Richardson and Neller returned to Washington, D.C.

and were evaluated on their ability to conduct offensive, defensive and counter-attack operations during the FINEX.

"ITX is probably the most realistic combined-arms training we can do in the Marine Corps," Greenwood said. "It's a great test of where we are as a regiment and will serve as a foundation for us to begin our mission-specific training for our deployment this fall, when we serve as the command element for [Special Purpose MAGTF-Crisis Response-Africa.]"

Designed as a culminating pre-deployment event, ITX tests a MAGTF within a standardized scenario, which is then assessed against established training and readiness standards by Tactical Training Exercise Control Group's evaluators, also known as Coyotes.

"It challenges everyone from the individual Marine all the way up to the Regimental MAGTF command element," Greenwood said. "It requires us to integrate every weapon system alongside our maneuver in a realistic scenario TTECG paints for us."

The goal of ITX is to ensure units are capable of operating as an integrated MAGTF. For Marines, this means learning to work in conjunction with the other

components that compose a MAGTF.

"We are integrating all the elements of a MAGTF, so we have squadrons from the [Air Combat Element,] the [Logistics Combat Element] and two infantry battalions," Greenwood said. "Additionally, we have support from other detachments such as light armored reconnaissance, tanks and artillery in order to give the Marines the most realistic training possible."

According to Capt. Eric B. Willis, company commander, 2nd Battalion, 8th Marine Regiment, this ITX was the first time many of his Marines were exposed to training encompassing a MAGTF.

"We inserted [via aircraft] to our location under the cover of artillery and close air support assets," Willis said. "From there, our role was to establish a blocking position to protect the battalion's flank and to drive the enemies into our engagement area."

The training during the FINEX is important exposure for the different operations they may conduct while on deployment.

"Giving the Marines a chance to experience and see what a MAGTF can do is definitely beneficial," Willis said. "The command relationship built with [2nd Marine Regiment] through-

out the FINEX will mirror our relationship during the upcoming deployment."

The training is also an important opportunity for the other elements of a MAGTF. Cpl. Mitchell W. Bland, field artillery cannoneer, 3rd Battalion, 10th Marine Regiment, explained that working alongside air and ground elements added another dimension to their training.

"Our mission is to provide direct support for the infantry and coordinate our fire with air support," Bland said. "Air support can't provide constant suppression. We mark their target with illumination rounds and provide suppression for ground elements when they are unable."

Throughout the FINEX, communication played an integral role as the various elements moved in unison to accomplish their objectives.

"One of the biggest concerns when you get a large group of people is ensuring all entities understand the absolute plan," said Gunnery Sgt. Nicholas L. Brown, watch officer, 2/8. "Being able to come together to accomplish the mission is what makes warfighters great. The Marines out here are doing great things for the Marine Corps and their units by setting an example throughout the ITX."

at Range 410.

The representatives also had the opportunity to visit the Range Sustainment Center, Exercise Support Division and Explosive Ordnance Disposal.

According to Talley, the group came to the installation to observe the service members training and determine if any members

of the group could give support to the base.

"We got to see how diligently the Marines treat their training, as well as how other entities on base help complete the base's objectives," Talley said. "Everyone enjoyed themselves and are walking away with more appreciation for their heroes, the people in the armed forces."



In addition we have hundreds of Korean War veterans, Vietnam veterans, and Cold War veterans who physically die each day. We must remember them.

And we must not neglect to keep ever before us in our thoughts and prayers the on-going sacrifice of so many current members of our armed forces and their families. As I write this column more than 6,800 troops have been killed in Afghanistan and Iraq and many, many thousands more have been injured. We must remember them.

How best to remember them?
It is my hope that each person reading this column will re-assess their priorities in life and make certain that they are using their talents and their time in pragmatic ways that improve the quality of life for others less fortunate than themselves.







Muddled 'Snow White' prequel-sequel mash-up can't find its way

'The Huntsman: Winter's War' Starring Chris Hemsworth, Jessica Chastain, Emily Blunt and Charlize Theron Directed by Cedric Nicolas-Troyan Rated PG-13

Hey Snow, where'd you go?

In 2012, Snow White and the Huntsman gave the age-old fairy tale a sassy new action-y feminist twist, with Kristin Stewart as the feisty, fair-skinned maiden—foretold by the Magic Mirror to be the loveliest in the land—and

Chris Hemsworth as the evil queen's "huntsman" ordered to take her into the woods and kill her.

Of course, things didn't quite work out that way—and now we have The Huntsman: Winter's War, a sequel. Actually it's a prequel. Well, I think it's a little of both, and a mash-up of several other things, too, and quite a bit of an all-around muddled mess.

And Snow White seems to have wisely decided to steer clear from it all. So there's no Snow in this Huntsman, unless you count the times she's mentioned by name. But the movie certainly isn't hurting for other talent. Hemsworth is back, and so is Charlize Theron as the wicked monarch Ravenna. Emily Blunt is newly aboard as Ravenna's sister Freya, turned into a cruel "ice queen" by an act of heartless treachery. Jessica Chastain is Sara, who like Hemsworth's rebellious Huntsman,

grew up as an abducted child soldier forced to serve in Freya's army of marauders.

British comedic actors Nick Frost and Rob Brydon, shrunk to wee size by the modern magic of digital effects, play a pair of dwarf brothers who provide most of the chuckles in this otherwise dull and dreary trek through a disjointed plot that feels like someone threw bits of Game of Thrones, Disney's Frozen, Lord of the Rings and The Wizard of Oz into a blender with some crushed ice, black goo and gold flecks, then set it to puree.

If you're into ornate costumes, you might dig the over-the-top duds in which Blunt and Theron get to vamp. In the couple of scenes they're together, I kept wishing Cher would suddenly appear—maybe descending from the ceiling—for a full-on Las Vegas revue.

The storybook decor is lush and quite lovely, especially when the Huntsman, Sara, the

two dwarves and their special-effect dwarf dates (Alexandra Roach and Sheridan Smith) take a day trip to Goblin Land, or something like that, to retrieve the purloined Magic Mirror, which looks like a huge polished cymbal from a music store. Some of the location filming was done in England's Windsor Great Park, although I'm pretty sure you won't find any big, blue ape-men, giant moss-covered snakes or tiny florescent flying fairies there.

Not campy and gonzo enough to be real fun, nor dark and dangerous enough to qualify as truly grim, this is instead a drab, disjointed stab by a first-time feature director who, bless his heart, can't seem to find his target in all the icy, FX-laden glop. The best—and most amazing—thing about it by far is its all-star, A-list cast, all of whom who gamely give it their best in the service of something clearly less than "the fairest of them all."
