# Hundreds gather for Sgt. Maj. Crespin's retirement ceremony

Hundreds of Marines, sailors and loved ones gathered in the stands of the Commanding General's lawn, Sept. 29, to watch as Sgt. Maj. Avery L. Crespin, sergeant major, Headquarters Battalion, delivered a heartfelt speech about his 22 years of service in the Corps and the lasting impact his time in service will have as he embarks on the next chapter of his life.

Crespin enlisted in the Corps in March 1995 and underwent recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego, Calif. More than two decades of active duty service provided Crespin the opportunity to serve in a multitude of billets, units and military occupational specialties, to include time spent as a Marine Security Guard.

During his time on MSG duty, Crespin served at MSG Detachments Islamabad, Pakistan, Caracas and Venezuela. During his tour in Pakistan, Crespin aided in the evacuation of all non-essential American personnel on two occasions due to embassy bombings in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, Nairobi, Kenya and various known threats in the region.

During his retirement ceremony, Sgt. Maj. Crespin received a meritorious service medal for his time in service. Lt. Col. Michael Cable, commanding officer, Headquarters Battalion, and a close friend of Crespin spoke during the ceremony. At the end of the service, Crespin delivered a speech that addressed topics such as his time in service and the people who helped and



# **Combat Center legal counsel** educates and advocates for victims

The Victim's Legal Counsel Organization is here to help. The VLCO is fully committed to providing legal advice, representation to victims of sexual assault and domestic violence and to ensure the victims' rights are protected at all stages of the military justice system, said Capt. Benjamin Goodrich, the Victims' Legal Counsel of the Western Region.

"I educate people on the military justice system, and their

rights and the options that are available to them," Goodrich said. "Most people aren't aware of their options or how those options can affect their decisions down the road. I provide counsel throughout the entire legal process."

The VLC can speak on your behalf to outside agencies to include command, investigators and other attorneys to support your choices and decisions. Clients have voices that can, at times, be overlooked throughout investigations and trial processes; the VLC is there to ensure the client's voice is heard. Goodrich said.

"Clients have interests, and their interests need someone to advocate for them, be it any time between pre-investigation to post-trial," Goodrich said. "I can represent their needs for them to investigators, their command, judges and attorneys to ensure their needs are met."

The VLCO offers free legal services to military service members, service member's dependents and DOD employ-


ees. The Combat Center VLCO is one of eight offices throughout the Marine Corps.



#### WHAT I'VE LEARNED

# Steven J.K. Haltom City, Texas Vehicle commander, 1st Tank Battalion ELLIOT

ELLIOT LOVES TO BUILD COMPUTERS. HE BUILT HIS OWN PERSONAL GAMING COMPUTER AND HAS HELPED OTHERS BUILD THEIR OWN PCs. When he leaves the Marine Corps, he plans on going to col-LEGE TO BECOME A PROGRAMMER AND MAKE HIS OWN VIDEO GAMES.

> I grew up in Haltom City, Texas. I lived with my mom, dad, and older sister. When I was around 10 years old we moved in to my cousin's old house when his family moved to the family ranch.

>My family has a ranch out of town where I did a lot of ranch work. I herded goats, did cattle work and broke horses, which means that I trained them to be safe to ride.

>I played baseball, football, cross-country and basketball in middle school until I injured my knees in the 8th grade. I joined the marching band in high school and played alto and tenor saxophone. Outside of marching band season, I focused my attention on theater. One day, I came in to the auditorium early to practice and I noticed that the stage manager and the tech crew hadn't cleaned up after themselves. I spent about an hour cleaning the stage because I didn't want an accident or injury to occur.

>My dad was a police officer in the city of White Settlement, Texas. Even though he always had work, he did try to make it to as many of my sports games as he could. He used to be a SWAT instructor and even though he is primarily a firearms instructor now he still works as a patrol

>My role model is my great-grandfather. My great-grandfather was born in the 1920s; he experienced the Great Depression and World War II. He saw the adversity that was going on in the world and he decided not to let it dictate what he did. He wanted to join the military but his brother already joined therefore he wasn't allowed to due to the sole survivor policy. Instead, he started a business that collected metal which was turned into bul-



let casings, which were then sent to the troops. He also had a wheat farm and three quarters of his crops were sent to feed the troops. Even after everything that happened he was able to persevere.

>My mom loved taking pictures and videos **of me** all the time. There's a catalog of my entire life, from when I was born until now. She worked as a McDonald's manager. I remember going behind the counter when I was a kid and choosing any of the toys I wanted. I ended up collecting most of the toys they sold there.

>My older sister, Adrian, and I used to fight **a lot** as kids. Now we are great friends, and we love spending time with each other. Before I turned 21, I was my sisters designated driver. Every time she would invite me somewhere, I knew I would be the driver. My sister was a little mad that she lost her DD when I came of age.

>One Christmas, we went to my family's home in Brownsville, Texas. My great uncle is a game rancher. He has 15 square miles of land where he raises everything from elk to Javelina hog. During our visit, my dad and I went out at four in the morning and about 30 minutes after we arrived over 20 deer and hogs surrounded the feeder. My dad noticed a deer with something sticking out of its hind leg. My uncle told him that it was a \$50 training dart that he lost, but the deer left before my dad got the chance to shoot it. About an hour and a half passed by and I shot a spike, which is a deer that is about two or three years old that has antlers that haven't started to grow outwards. That was the first hunt I ever went on with my dad.

>l joined the military because I remember watching the World Trade Center falling on September 11th. The reason I joined the Marine Corps was because I was told by several of my teachers that I was lazy and did subpar work. I knew that wasn't true and wanted to serve my country while proving them wrong.

>If I could give someone advice it would be that there are good times and bad times, and you just have to roll with the punches. Don't let your bad times ruin your good times.



# **Methodist University grad leads** relief efforts on ground in Dominica

U.S. Marine Maj. Robert Gill, class of 2004, put his minor in leadership from Methodist University in Favetteville, North Carolina, to use on the Caribbean island of Dominica in the aftermath of Hurricane Maria with the Joint Task Force - Leeward Islands as the officer in charge of the task force's security element.

The task force is a U.S. military unit composed of Marines, Soldiers, Sailors and Airmen, and represents U.S. Southern Command's primary response to the hurricanes that have affected the eastern Caribbean.

Gill and his Marines support JTF-LI by providing security and stability on the ground at landing zones and at the U.S. Department of State's evacuation control center, assisting the voluntary departure of boring island of Martinique.

Gill is a reserve Marine with Special Purpose Marine Air Ground Task Force - Southern Command, a unit deployed to Central America during the hurricane season. In the wake of Hurricane Irma, the unit was tasked to serve as the backbone U.S Southern Command's response to that hurricane, and Hurricane Maria, in the Caribbean's Leeward Isles.

When talking about the more than 70 Marines under his command on Dominica, Gill says they come from diverse backgrounds, they continually demonstrate selflessness and there is nothing more awe-inspiring than to work with them.

"It's an honor to be able to lead these Marines," he said.

The security element arrived on Dominica on Sept. 23, and immediately

They hit the ground running, literally, rushing out to greet arriving aircraft dropping off rescued survivors and hustling to help helicopters disembark passengers and take off again, with engines still running.

They braved roads blocked by debris and washed out by landslides to secure landing zones, allowing search-and-rescue personnel to land in areas known to have U.S. citizens in need of assistance.

It was intense work in an austere and challenging environment. Gill provides leadership to keep his team going, focused on the mission and what needs to be done.

When asked how his time at Methodist University prepared him for this deployment, Gill said he learned to never give up, whatever you do. "Set goals, there will be bumps but stay focused, keep driving and

This advice clearly served him and his team well. Before they closed the evacuation mission, Gill's team facilitated the evacuation of more than 300 American citizens and others to safety from Dominica.

They are currently facilitating the delivery of much-needed humanitarian aid by helicopter to areas of Dominica that remain unreachable by road.

When he is not serving duty as Marine, Gill works as an operations analyst for the Armed Services Cooperation in Alexandria, Virginia.

"With my experience as a Marine and in my civilian career, I've been able to build on the foundation of leadership training that started for me at Methodist University. As Marines, we train for a variety of situations. Being able to use our skills to help the people of Dominica makes this mission even more meaningful."


