Primed for the Future

The Fabrication Laboratory (FABLAB) conducted a proof of concept experiment aboard the Combat Center, March 15. The FABLAB, along with personnel from Tactical Training Exercise Control Group's Small Unidentified Aerial Systems (sUAS) cell, tested disruption of another drone through kinetic means.

"Drones will be prevalent on the next battlefield and we have already started to see it," said Capt. David Murray, officer in charge, FABLAB. "There is currently no universal defeat to drones, which is similar to fighting against an Improved Explosive Device (IED)."

According to Murray, the battlefield is constantly changing. As Marines we must adapt and overcome with unorthodox methods to accomplish the mission. From operations like Desert Shield and Desert Storm, to the current fight, constant development in all technological facets is required in order to stay ahead of the enemy. The FABLAB is currently following this trend by furthering progress on drones.

The FABLAB is open to all Marines, including Marine Corps Communication-Electronics School students, in order to expose them to some of the technology offered. Most of the Marines who partake in the FABLAB are from a generation

that is exposed to more technology than the Marines who preceded them which leads to a faster understanding.

With the older generations providing operational experience from previous wars and the younger generations cultivating new ideas, more viable options are created for the battlefield. Whether those options are presented in the form of a new product or a refinement to a specific Technique, Tactic, or Procedure (TTP), they will benefit the Corps' chance for success.

The FABLAB identifies their

strong and weak points for each platform in order to understand the critical requirements needed to facilitate their mission. They have made it user friendly so any Marine can pick up a controller and go.

"As a whole, we need to understand that drones are not an isolated problem and they won't just affect the front lines," Murray said. "It's a universal thing that everyone will encounter in the battlefield of the future and programs like the FABLAB help ensure that we remain ready."



Observation Post One Year Old

One anniversary candle and 47 issues ago, the Twentynine Palms Marine Corps Base newspaper became a reality. Its name, the Observation Post, was selected through a "Name Your Base Paper" contest, and the first issue went to press on Thursday, March 21, 1957 as a four-page bi-weekly. As stated in the first issue, the primary functions of this newspaper will be to supplement the broad news-coverage of the American press and radio by giving military personnel detailed coverage on service matters of particular interest to them.

Went Weekly

When only six issues old, the Observation Post went weekly on June 6. On July 18, the paper became eligible to compete for the Marine Corps' Annual Journalism

The privilege to compete was extended to the Base Paper on the basis of its growth and development, news coverage, journalistic excellence and general contribution to the welfare and morale of the command.

The Palms publication has been putting out a six page paper since February 4, 1958, which has


enabled wider coverage on service matters of particular interest to members of this base.

WHAT I'VE LEARNED

Pittsburgh, Penn. Retired Marine Corps Sergeant Major

GELETKO

> I was born and raised in Pittsburgh, Penn., where I lived in a housing project in a large family setting. I had more than 50 cousins and other extended family members as my neighbors. I enjoyed having family around all the time because there was always something to do, or someone to play sports with.

> It was normal for us to play sports, so that's what we all did. I played football, ice hockey and baseball throughout high school.

> After high school, I started boxing and working at a steel mill, where I worked for three and a half years. I got laid off so I decided to go to college at Allegheny Junior College in Pennsylvania. I went to college for almost two years and played baseball and drove a truck part time.

> In 1983 I realized my life wasn't really going anywhere so I told my family I was thinking about the service. They automatically wanted me to join the Marine Corps. I decided to enlist into the United States Marine Corps when I was 23 as an 0311.

> My first duty station was in Okinawa, Japan. In those 2 years, I went on deployments in Korea, Guam and the Philippines. It was mind bending to be so far away from home and in an exotic environment. Around this time, I began training in other martial arts forms, like kick boxing and Muay Thai, and continued to box at an amateur level. I also became heavily involved in the Marine Corps Martial Arts Program in its various forms.

> My second duty station was [Marine Corps Base] Camp Lejeune, N.C., at 2nd Marines Battalion. During my time there, I went on a Mediterranean/Marine Expeditionary Unit float through the Middle East and Europe in 1986. I met my wife, Anita, while we were both stationed in North Carolina. We got married in 1989 and a year later had my first son,



After being in Camp **Lejeune,** I was promoted to sergeant. I got orders to be a Primary Marksmanship Instructor on [Marine Corps Recruit Depot] Parris Island, S.C., where I coached Marines at the rifle range.

> During my time at Parris Island, I made a lot of friends who convinced me to get my B billet out of the way and get on the drill field. Being a drill instructor is a lot of hard work, both physically and mentally. I did really well on the drill field and was meritoriously promoted to staff sergeant.

> After serving my 2 year tour as a drill instructor, I got orders to [Marine Corps Base] Camp Pendleton, Calif., where I deployed with a Marine Expeditionary Unit to the Western Pacific, Korea, Guam, Indonesia, the Philippines and Okinawa. I spent my last two years working at the Camp Pendleton brig as the Duty Warden. It was interesting because I got to see the underbelly of the Marine Corps.

> In 1993 my second son, Daniel, was born. Soon after, I was promoted to gunnery sergeant and got orders to [Marine Corps Base] Quantico, Virginia. I spent the beginning of my tour in Virginia working at the Security Battalion as a training chief. I later got the opportunity to be a senior drill instructor for the Officer Candidate School in the summer. I was retained at OCS as

permanent party and became the Company gunnery sergeant for Charlie Company.

> After being there for three years, I got promoted to first sergeant and got orders to Twentynine Palms, Calif. I arrived in the fall of 2001 and started off as 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines, Fox Company's First Sergeant. I went on a Unit Deployment Program to Okinawa with them and two deployments to Iraq.

> I was almost sent out to Iraq again, but instead I was sent over to be the first sergeant at Marines Corps Communication-Electronics School for six months before I picked up Sergeant Major. It was very different going from grunt life to working with students, but my background as a drill instructor came in handy.

> In 2004, I was moved over to 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines, 7th Marine Regiment, as their sergeant major, where I deployed to Iraq for 10 months. This deployment was interesting because our battalion covered a large area of Western Iraq, and had a lot of contact with insurgent forces. Our Marines patrolled frequently, and worked harder than any unit I had been stationed with in the past. They were the best young men I have ever had the pleasure of serving

> When I got back to Twentynine Palms, Headquarters Marine Corps attempted to give me orders to recruiting duty, but I opted to stay and move to Headquarters Battalion as the sergeant major. During this time, I was able to finish my degree in Organizational Management from Ashford University.

> After 27 years in the Marine Corps, I decided to retire. My family was doing well here so we stayed and I got a job on base with the Advisor Training Group in Camp Wilson, where I helped train teams to go to Afghanistan and train Afghan Police. I worked there for 3 years until the program was shut down I've now been working as

a contractor out of 7th Marine Regiment as a PreDeployment coordinator for the past 4 years.

> In 2007, after the last Iraq deployment, I was able to help start Fight Club 29/Marine Mixed Martial Arts Team here at the Combat Center. My active duty fighters compete in boxing, kickboxing, Muay Thai, Brazilian Ju Jitsu, submission grappling and mixed martial arts competitions all over the southwest United States.

> Our team has multiple championships and has placed two fighters in the UFC and one in Bellator, after their service in the Corps. Our team also trains women in boxing and Muay Thai for self defense, and regularly gives self defense classes to spouses and dependents here at the Combat Center. The team has been my passion the last ten years and as a life time martial artist, I am blessed to be able to give back to the installation's community.





IN THE ALPS

Mountain Marines compete in France

CHAMROUSSE, France – After competing the week prior in Germany, the Mountain Leaders Section, Mountain Warfare Training Center, Bridgeport, Calif., traveled to the French Alps to compete in the Mountain Troops Winter Challenge 2018, a competition that tests mountain warfare skills and tactics, hosted by the French Army. This marked the first time that U.S. Marines competed in MTWC-18.

Located at the renowned Chamrousse ski resort high above the city of Grenoble, the event provided some challenging Olympic-tier courses and incredibly difficult scenarios. In addition to the French hosts, teams from Germany, Italy, Lebanon, Georgia and the United Kingdom took part in the event.

The first of two days consisted of a welcoming introduction by the French leadership, the international teams familiarizing themselves with the French FAMAS service rifle, and later into the evening, the main touring ski event up to the top of the summit at Chamrousse. The event posed significant challenges due to the steep incline on certain portions of the track and incredibly high winds. While the first competitors reached the top around 8:30 p.m., the Marines summited around 9:15 p.m., in front of the Lebanese and Georgian teams and several French teams.


After every team had summited, they were given torches to carry down the mountain in ceremonial fashion per French tradition. At the bottom of the mountain a small celebration was held to commemorate the completion of the first day, with a light show and hot food.

The second day of the competition consisted of another touring ski event up the mountain, with a casualty evacuation with a snow litter on the way back down. The shooting portion was cancelled due to hazardous weather conditions at the summit where shooting

would have taken place. The competition concluded with a final award ceremony. Overall, the Marines placed fourth internationally among the six nations that participated in the competition.

"It has been a pleasure to have the U.S. Marines compete

here this year," said the French Major who was the primary organizer and requested to remain anonymous. "We hope that you enjoyed yourself and enjoyed the challenge, and we hope to see you again next year."


