1. Situation. The Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command (MAGTFTC) conducts live-fire combined arms training to promote operating force military readiness. The Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC) provides facilities, services, and support to the resident units, Marines, Sailors, and their families. We must operate in an environmentally-sound manner and comply with applicable environmental and land use laws and regulations.

2. Cancellation. CCO 5090.8A

3. Mission. To establish a systematic approach for integrating environmental considerations and accountability into day-to-day decision making and long term planning process across mission, activities, and functions in accordance with references (a) through (k).

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. Conformance with the references is intended to enable the Combat Center to achieve and maintain environmental compliance and protection while sustaining resources essential to combat training.

(2) Concept of Operations. The Assistant Chief of Staff G-4, Environmental Impact Review Board (EIRB), Environmental Management System (EMS) Team, and the Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs (NREA)

Director, will implement and manage the Combat Center's EMS Program and ensure proposed actions aboard the Combat Center comply with references (a) through (k), environmental and land use laws, and regulations.

b. Subordinate Element Missions

(1) Environmental Impact Review Board

(a) The Chief of Staff serves as the Chair of EIRB. The Chairperson will task or assign ad hoc members to the board from installation organizations or tenant commands as required or as recommended by the executive agent in accordance with reference (d) and (j).

(2) Environmental Management System Team. The EMS Team is comprised of the EMS Management Committee and the EMS Implementation/Maintenance Working Group.

(a) The Environmental Management System Management Committee. The EMS Management Committee reviews and oversees EMS planning and implementation and sustaining efforts.

(b) Environment Management System Implementation/Maintenance Working Group. The EMS Implementation/Maintenance Working Group ensures effective execution, communications, and coordination among all participating organizations.

(c) The Director, NREA serves as the Chair of the EMS Management Committee and the EMS Coordinator serves as the Chair of the EMS Implementation/Maintenance Working Group.

(d) Effective immediately the following personnel are appointed as primary members of the EMS Team:

1. Director NREA serves as the Chair of the EMS Management Committee.

2. Deputy NREA serves within the EMS Management Committee.

3. EMS Coordinator NREA serves within the EMS Management Committee.

4. NREA Media Managers serve within the EMS Management Committee.

5. EMS Coordinator serves as the Chair of the EMS Implementation/Maintenance Working Group.

6. Activity Deputy Directors and Executive Officers serve within the EMS Implementation/Maintenance Working Group.

7. Activity and Organization Environmental Compliance Coordinators serve within the EMS Implementation/Maintenance Working Group

(3) Assistant Chief of Staff G-4

(a) The Commanding General (CG) has delegated to the Assistant Chief of Staff G-4 overall responsibility for implementing and sustaining the EMS, and has delegated authority to the EMS Coordinator to implement and sustain the EMS.

(b) Ensure the EMS Manual is reviewed annually, complies with higher level directives, and is available for all activities and personnel to utilize.

(4) Director, Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs. Serve on the EIRB, Chair of the EMS Management Committee and identify an EMS Coordinator for implementing and sustaining the EMS.

(5) Office of General Counsel

(a) Serve as a member of the Combat Center's Environmental Planning Staff.

(b) Review the EMS manual for compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

(c) Advise the Commanding General and staff of appropriate subsequent action.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Marine Corps policy establishes effective program management through the execution and implementation of an EMS. The goal of the Marine Corps EMS is to enable Marine Corps units, tenants, commands, and installations to achieve and maintain environmental compliance and protection while sustaining resources essential to combat training and readiness.

(2) Current policy continues to implement functional EMSs at all appropriate levels, promotes continued improvement in Marine Corps environmental compliance programs, and seeks to leverage the EMS to meet evolving Executive Order and Department of Defense policy requirements for mission sustainability.

(3) Assistant Chiefs of Staff and Public Works Officer serve on the EIRB and are responsible for reviewing and concurring on EMS policy, procedures, and Management reviews. EMS policy and procedures will be distributed electronically by the EMS Coordinator for review, comment, and or concurrence.

(4) Special Staff Officers, Commanding Officers, Officers-In-Charge, and military and civilians training and operating aboard the Combat Center shall familiarize themselves and comply with the references.

(5) Special Staff Officers, Commanding Officers, and Officers-In-Charge shall identify and appoint an Environmental Compliance Coordinator.
