Subj: COMMANDER'S PHILOSOPHY

In the same manner, I expect everyone to be rewarded and recommended for awards at the lowest level possible. We reward sustained superior performance. We must recognize our team for doing their job consistently and well. AWARDS AND PUNISHMENT WILL BE GIVEN QUICKLY AND JUSTLY DELAYS ARE UNACCEPTABLE!
- 5. WORK/LIFE BALANCE. Our mission is about training, however we cannot and will not forget our families. Achieving life balance with our single Marines, Sailors, civilians, and our families is challenging. Although our mission requires us to work long hours away from our families, we shall maximize the amount of quality time off for our service members and civilians and foster meaningful relationships with our local community.
