1. Situation. The Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command (MAGTFTC), Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC) must effectively and efficiently conduct mission essential protection programs in the following areas: Antiterrorism; Physical Security; Critical Infrastructure Protection; Continuity of Operations; Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and High-Yield Explosive; Installation Emergency Management; Law Enforcement; Fire Protection and Emergency Services; Safety; and Force Protection. These efforts are conducted under the oversight of the Special Staff, Mission Assurance (MA).
