1. Situation. In accordance with reference (a), the Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command (MAGTFTC), Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC) will receive a five day Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC) Mission Assurance Assessment from 14 September 2020 to 18 September 2020. Due to COVID-19 travel restrictions and installation protection priorities, this assessment will be conducted in a phased approach by incorporating both virtual and limited on-site assessment activities. The virtual component of the assessment will be accomplished using secure video teleconference (SVTC) and other unclassified meetings approved online communication and collaboration platforms. The assessment will be conducted in accordance with enclosure (1).

2. Mission. MAGTFTC, MCAGCC and tenant organizations execute the Mission Assurance Assessment (MAA) in accordance with reference (a) in order to better assess our vulnerabilities as they relate to critical tasks and the ability to execute our mission.

3. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. The purpose of the MAA is to identify and/or review Task Critical Assets and ensure that we are adequately protecting those assets in order to ensure mission success. The end state is Phase I of the MAA has been successfully completed and the installation is postured to conduct Phase II as directed. Provide guidance to support this assessment's benchmarks and coordination package in accordance with references (b) and (c).

(2) Concept of Operation

(a) This LOI will provide guidance and support the execution of this assessment in accordance with references (a) and (c), respectively. It will inform and outline responsibilities and obligations required of MAGTFTC,

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MCAGCC and tenant organizations in order to prepare for and support this assessment. The results of this assessment will be used as a foundation for this command to prioritize future Mission Assurance Programs funding requests and to ensure a safe and secure work environment for all aboard this installation. Selected MAGTFTC, MCAGCC Directors, Division Managers, Special Staff Officers and Tenant Command representatives are requested to attend the in-brief (via in-person or virtual), to be conducted by the Mission Marine Corps Assurance Assessment Program (MCMAAP) Team Leader and the Assistant Chief of Staff (AC/S), Installation Support Directorate (ISD) on 14 September 2020, at 0830 in the installation's Emergency Operations Center (EOC), Building 2080.

(b) Upon the conclusion of the in-brief, individual MCMAAP assessors will conduct their virtual risk assessments with installation's subject matter experts in accordance with enclosure (1). All activities/tenant organizations will provide the support and coordination necessary to ensure these assessments are a success.

(c) Phase II of the MAA will be conducted on order and conditions based.

b. Subordinate Element Missions

(1) Commanding Officers (COs), ACs/S, Officers-in-Charge (OICs), Deputy Directors (DepDirs), Division Directors (DivDirs), and Special Staff Officers

(a) Selected personnel attend the in-brief on 14 September 2020, at 0830 in the installation's EOC, Building 2080 or via online platform.

(b) Prepare to meet with MCMAAP assessors as needed per reference (b) from 14 September 2020 through 18 September 2020 per enclosure (1).

(2) AC/S MAGTF Training Directorate. Provide input and subject matter expertise to the installation's mission briefing to MCMAAP members on 14 September 2020, at 0830 in the installation's EOC, Building 2080.

(3) AC/S ISD. Provide input and subject matter expertise to the installation's mission briefing to MCMAAP members on 14 September 2020, at 0830 in the installation's EOC, Building 2080.

(a) Mission Assurance Division. Conduct overall coordination and execution in regards to this HQMC mission assurance assessment, to include developing the mission briefing that is presented to the MCMAAP members.

(b) Provide access to Building 2080 to the MCMAAP team as required.

(c) Coordinate SVTC and teleconference (telecon) requirements as necessary in accordance with enclosure (1).

(d) Coordinate with COs, ACs/S, OICs, DepDirs, DivDirs, Special Staff Officers and Tenant Commands to ensure that select personnel required to support the execution of the MCMAAP are identified and attend required SVTCs and telecons.

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(4) AC/S Communication Directorate. As necessary provide support to the AC/S, ISD for the conduct of SVTCs.

(5) COs of Tenant Commands

(a) Request that selected personnel attend the in-brief on 14 September 2020, at 0830 in the installation's EOC, Building 2080 or via the online platform.

(b) Request that selected personnel meet with MCMAAP assessors as needed per reference (b) and in accordance with enclosure (1) from 14 September 2020 through 18 September 2020.

(6) Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS). Request that a NCIS representative attend the in-brief on 14 September 2020, at 0830 and be prepared to give a local unclassified threat brief if required.


