Subj: COMMANDING GENERAL'S SAFETY AWARDS PROGRAM AND SAFETY MANAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS

1. Situation. Recognizing and reinforcing safety excellence is essential to sustaining force preservation, mission readiness, and effective risk management across Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command (MAGTFTC), Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC). Commands that successfully integrate safety into leadership, planning, operations, and daily decision-making contribute directly to reduced mishaps, stronger organizational performance, and a healthier, more resilient force. The Marine Corps Safety Management System (MCSMS) provides the foundation for achieving these outcomes through structured safety management, risk management integration, leadership involvement, and continuous improvement. In support of these objectives, MAGTFTC, MCAGCC establishes the Commanding General's Safety Awards Program to recognize exceptional individuals and organizations and establishes safety management expectations that enable commands to build, sustain, and demonstrate award-worthy safety programs.

2. Cancellation. CCO 5100.15R.

3. Mission. Establish the Commanding General's Safety Awards Program to recognize organizations and individuals who demonstrate superior performance in force preservation, Risk Management (RM), mishap prevention, and safety leadership. Establish supporting safety management requirements to enable commands to build measurable, effective, and sustainable safety programs aligned with the MCSMS.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent

(a) This Order establishes the Commanding General's Safety Awards Program as a means to recognize exceptional safety performance and promote a culture of safety excellence across MAGTFTC, MCAGCC. Supporting safety management requirements establish the framework and expectations necessary for commands to develop, sustain, and demonstrate effective safety programs that strengthen force preservation, mishap prevention, and mission readiness.

(b) Commanding Officers (COs), Assistant Chiefs of Staff (ACs/S), Deputy Directors (DepDirs), Division Directors (DivDirs), Officers-in-Charge (OICs), Special Staff Officers (SSOs), and Supervisors at all levels will foster and recognize effective safety performance through participation in the Commanding General's Safety Awards Program. One award shall be presented to an organization, and one award shall be presented to an individual per reference (a). Leaders will ensure personnel are provided with the guidance necessary to support award submissions and recognition of noteworthy safety contributions.

(c) COs, ACs/S, DepDirs, DivDirs, OICs, SSOs, and Supervisors at all levels will implement this Order and any instructions directly related to safety not necessarily contained or enclosed herein. Local policies may establish equal or more stringent guidance.

(d) All directorates/sections will integrate RM into planning, decision-making, and execution of training, operations, and daily activities, both on and off duty. Documentation and execution of RM are integral to Marine Corps, civilian, operational, and non-operational activities. The Joint Risk Assessment Tool (JRAT) may be utilized to support deliberate risk assessments. JRAT is a Web-based software application found at <https://jrat.safety.army.mil/login.aspx>.

(e) COs, ACs/S, DepDirs, DivDirs, OICs, SSOs, and Supervisors at all levels will ensure all serious mishaps (Class A and B) are briefed to the first general officer in the chain of command within seven days and provide the circumstances surrounding the mishap and the steps taken to prevent recurrence. In addition, organizations shall utilize the Risk Management Information (RMI)/Streamlined Incident Reporting (SIR) system of record for mishap, hazard, near miss, and incident reporting, recording, investigation, and analysis, as applicable, in accordance with reference (a). The Common Access Card (CAC) enabled RMI/SIR system may be accessed at <https://afsas.safety.af.mil/>.

(2) Concept of Operations. Establish and sustain a comprehensive safety program that promotes a culture where safety and risk management are integrated into daily operations, strengthens force preservation and mission readiness, and recognizes the safety accomplishments and superior contributions of Marines and civilian Marines aboard the Combat Center.

b. Subordinate Element Missions

(1) COs, ACs/S, DepDirs, DivDirs, OICs, SSOs, and Supervisors

(a) Establish, support, and sustain safety programs that demonstrate leadership engagement, proactive risk management, measurable performance, and continuous improvement in support of force preservation, mishap prevention, and mission readiness.

(b) Promote participation in the Commanding General's Safety Awards Program by recognizing noteworthy safety initiatives, innovations, program improvements, leadership contributions, and measurable safety achievements within their organizations.

(c) Designate command and directorate/section Safety Representatives (SRs) in writing and ensure they are responsible for execution of this Order. SRs shall be provided the authority, direct leadership access, training, and resources necessary to develop, sustain, and demonstrate effective safety programs and support Commanding General's Safety Award submissions.

(d) Employ available resources and assessment tools to strengthen safety programs, identify improvement opportunities, evaluate organizational climate, analyze trends, and support development of high-performing, award-worthy safety programs.

(e) Integrate RM into planning, decision-making, and execution of training, operations, and activities, both on and off duty. Provide required RM training and ensure documentation of training in accordance with applicable requirements.

(f) Conduct operational pauses at least semiannually to review safety performance, reinforce training, evaluate procedures, assess organizational safety posture, and address emerging risks or trends.

1. Back-In-The-Saddle operational pauses should be held before or following extended unit leave, extended winter holiday period or post-deployment. At the commander's discretion, this may serve as one of the semiannual safety operational pauses.

2. Command safety events may serve as a semiannual safety operational pause provided all available hands attend.

(g) Maintain traffic safety programs appropriate to organizational operations to support force preservation, mishap prevention, and effective safety program performance, including compliance with required traffic safety training, driver awareness, and local traffic familiarization requirements.

1. All military personnel under the age of 26 shall complete an approved traffic safety course through the Installation Safety Office or MarineNet. First gaining commands shall ensure Marines under 26 years of age receive required driver awareness training within 60 days of reporting.

2. Training shall include a minimum of 30 minutes of local traffic familiarization. This one-time training will be documented by S-3/Training via Marine Corps Training Information Management System. SRs shall coordinate enrollment with the Safety Office as required.

(h) Ensure serious mishaps, hazards, near misses, and incidents are properly reported, analyzed, and utilized to drive corrective actions, lessons learned, and continuous improvement. Utilize the RMI/ SIR program of record database in accordance with applicable requirements.

(i) Provide timely and accurate safety data, metrics, program information, and organizational participation necessary to support Safety Councils, Mission Assurance Working Groups, MCSMS reporting requirements, and the exchange of safety information, initiatives, lessons learned, and best practices. Organizations may be required to provide supporting information to the Safety Office for monthly MCSMS reporting requirements. The Safety Office submits the MCSMS report through the Commanding General (CG), Training and Education Command, to the Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps via the official MCSMS reporting platform at https://usmc.sharepoint-mil.us/sites/TECOM_Safety/SitePages/Safety.aspx.

(2) MCAGCC Tenant Commands and Visiting Commands. Adherence to safety standards is required to promote safety and health aboard the Combat Center. MAGTFTC, MCAGCC tenants at other DoD installations shall adhere to the standards established by those installations. All units stationed aboard MAGTFTC, MCAGCC or operating aboard the installation will adhere to MAGTFTC, MCAGCC standards.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) To support development, sustainment, and demonstration of effective safety programs and participation in the Commanding General's Safety Awards Program, the Safety Office maintains Combat Center approved procedures, program guidance, inspection schedules, training requirements, and implementation resources at <https://www.29palms.marines.mil/Staff-Offices/Special-Staff/Mission-Assurance/Safety-Office/>. Information maintained therein includes, but is not limited to, the following:

(a) Reference (b), MAGTFTC, MCAGCC Safety Program encompassing all safety management procedures, regulatory guidance, and implementation requirements applicable to occupational safety and health, traffic safety, radiation safety, laser safety, explosives safety, and related force preservation programs.

(b) Inspection, evaluation, hazard identification, reporting, and corrective action processes used to assess organizational safety performance and compliance.

(c) Safety training requirements, operational controls, and standard operating procedures intended to strengthen risk management integration, hazard mitigation, and continuous improvement.

(d) Program requirements for safety personnel, organizational responsibilities, reporting, records management, and administrative compliance requirements.

(e) Supporting forms, resources, and supplemental guidance necessary for execution of this Order.

(2) CG's Safety Awards Program

(a) The CG's Safety Awards Program recognizes exceptional individual and organizational contributions that strengthen safety performance, force preservation, mishap prevention, risk management, and mission readiness across MAGTFTC, MCAGCC. All units, tenant commands, directorates/sections, and special staff sections are strongly encouraged to identify and nominate personnel, teams, and organizations demonstrating noteworthy safety achievements, innovation, leadership, measurable performance improvements, or sustained contributions to safety excellence.

(b) The individual safety award shall be presented in honor of Daniel K. Mulvihill in recognition of his 20 years of service as a Safety and Occupational Health Specialist and his distinguished military service, including receipt of the Silver Star for actions at Hill 488 during the Vietnam War. Awards may recognize contributions in traffic safety, ground safety, occupational safety and health, off duty/recreation safety, or other significant safety initiatives, whether current, ongoing, or sustained over multiple years.

(c) Nominations may be submitted for active-duty personnel, civilian employees, units, organizations, directorates/sections, tenant commands, and special staff sections in accordance with reference (a). Individual nominees shall possess a minimum of one year of service at the time of nomination.

(d) Nominations shall be submitted to the MAGTFTC, MCAGCC Safety Office no later than 30 September of each fiscal year utilizing enclosure (1) the MAGTFTC, MCAGCC Safety Award Nomination Worksheet. Submission packages shall include, at a minimum, applicable nominee information, summary of accomplishments, detailed justification, measurable impact or supporting metrics, command endorsement, and supporting documentation, as applicable.

(e) An Awards Committee consisting of the Safety Director or Deputy, Headquarters Battalion Safety Officer, and senior tenant command Safety Officer will review submissions and provide recommendations to the Chief of Staff for further review prior to forwarding to the CG for final consideration.

(f) Awards may include Certificates of Commendation, impact awards, letters of appreciation, plaques, safety coins, or other forms of recognition as approved by the CG. Award presentations will normally occur during the first quarter of the following fiscal year.

(3) Naval Medical Support. Effective safety management programs rely upon appropriate occupational health and industrial hygiene support. Organizations shall utilize local naval medical facilities where available and ensure alternate occupational health services meet applicable Navy Bureau of Medicine and Surgery requirements when local support is unavailable.

(4) Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). Proper management, protection, and authorized release of safety investigation information are essential elements of effective safety program administration. Safety investigation reports are generally Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI). The Commander, Naval Safety Command, is the FOIA release authority for safety investigation reports.
