Subj: VEHICLE SMOG INSPECTION PROGRAM

(a) 40 CFR 51.356

- (b) California Health and Safety Code § 44011
- (c) MCO 5090.2 (d) CCO 1630.8G
- 1. <u>Situation</u>. Federal agencies are required to ensure all vehicles owned, leased, or operated by civilian and military personnel aboard federal installations provide proof of compliance with California smog inspection requirements. References (a) through (d) provide civilian and military personnel aboard the Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command (MAGTFTC), Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC) with policy and procedural quidance governing the Vehicle Smog Inspection Program (VSIP).
- 2. Cancellation. CCO 6280.2G.
- 3. $\underline{\text{Mission}}$. To publish instructions for the conduct, recordkeeping, and reporting of the MAGTFTC, MCAGCC VSIP.

4. Execution

- a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations
- (1) <u>Commander's Intent</u>. All military and civilian personnel operating a motor vehicle aboard the Combat Center comply with this Order and the law.

(2) Concept of Operations

- (a) Updates to the California Smog Inspection Program became effective on 1 January 2010, and apply to all vehicles owned, leased, or operated by civilian and military personnel aboard federal installations within California, as well as agency-owned or operated vehicles, except tactical military vehicles.
- (b) Pursuant to the Federal Clean Air Act and the United States Environmental Protection Agency policy, federal agencies shall ensure personnel who operate motor vehicles on federal installations (without regard to whether such vehicles are registered in California) shall furnish proof of compliance with federal and California smog inspection requirements.

- (c) Volume 6, Chapter 3 Section 030305 Vehicle I/M of reference (d), requires vehicles operated aboard a Marine Corps facility comply with state requirements even if the vehicle is not registered in that state.
- (d) All motor vehicles operated aboard the Combat Center shall furnish proof of compliance with California's vehicle inspection and maintenance program for smog in one of two ways:
- $\underline{1}$. Present a valid California registration at the time of registering the motor vehicle aboard the Combat Center; or
- $\underline{2}$. Present a current smog inspection receipt that indicates the vehicle is in compliance with smog standards.
- (e) All motor vehicles shall be required biennially to obtain a certificate of compliance, except for the following:
- $\underline{\textbf{1}}$. Any vehicle with a valid permanent California registration.
 - 2. Gasoline powered vehicles eight or less model-years old.
- \underline{a} . If there is evidence that a vehicle has a modified emissions control system, the vehicle will be subject to this Order and, thereby, must provide a California smog inspection receipt upon registering with the Combat Center.
 - 3. Motorcycles.
- $\underline{4}$. Diesel powered vehicles manufactured prior to 1998 or have a gross vehicle weight rating greater than 14,000 pounds.
- $\underline{5}$. Any gasoline powered vehicle, including hybrids, manufactured prior to the 1976 model-year.
 - 6. Electric vehicles.
- $\underline{7}$. Any collector motor vehicle that meets the following criteria:
 - a. Is at least 35 years old.
- \underline{b} . The vehicle passes a functional inspection of the fuel cap and visual inspection for liquid fuel leaks.
- $\underline{\mathtt{c}}.$ Submission of proof of collector insurance when registering vehicle.
- $\underline{8}\,.$ All motor vehicles that have been issued a repair cost waiver during the preceding six months.
- $\underline{9}$. Tactical military vehicles or visiting foreign military tactical vehicles.
- $\underline{10}$. Natural gas powered with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 14,000 lbs.

- b. <u>Subordinate Element Missions.</u> Assistant Chief of Staff (AC/S) Installation Support Directorate (ISD)/G-4.
- (1) <u>Southwest Region Fleet Transportation</u>. Ensure that government owned non-tactical fleet vehicles are in compliance with this Order.

(2) Director, Environmental Affairs (EA)

- \underline{a} . Provide liaison with the federal, state, and local regulators to ensure the MAGTFTC, MCAGCC VSIP meets all regulatory requirements.
- $\underline{\textbf{b}}_{\cdot}.$ Submit all reports concerning the MAGTFTC, MCAGCC VSIP to the regulatory agencies as required.
- \underline{c} . Provide regulatory guidance to the Provost Marshal's Office, the AC/S ISD/G-4, and any fleet manager concerning this program.
- (3) <u>Director, Mission Assurance</u>. Maintain records on Department of Defense vehicle registration. Provide records to EA upon request.
- 5. <u>Administration and Logistics</u>. Directives issued by this Headquarters are published and distributed electronically. Electronic versions of Combat Center directives can be found at https://www.29palms.marines.mil/Staff-Offices/Resource-Management-Directorate/Adjutant-Office/Orders/.

6. Command and Signal

a. <u>Command</u>. This Order is applicable to all commands, organizations, units and activities located aboard the Combat Center except as exempted above.

b. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed.
