1. Situation. The mission of Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC) is to support the Service Level Training and Exercise Program through logistical and service support activities and provide a standard of excellence in managing infrastructure, services and support to the Fleet Marine Force (FMF) and families to ensure the readiness of the tenant and resident commands aboard the Combat Center. We achieve this through the conduct of live-fire and non-live fire training, to assess the effectiveness of operational forces, units and Marine Air Ground Task Force (MAGTF) in command and control, the coordination of integrated air-ground fires, logistics operations and refine existing tactics, techniques, and procedures to develop more efficient means to accomplish the FMF mission. Policies and procedures addressed in this Order assist in supporting active and reserve units of the operating forces aboard the Combat Center to include joint and combined training for expeditionary operations.

2.  $\underline{\text{Mission}}$ . To promulgate policy for the management, control, safe handling, storage, field storage, transportation, and demilitarization of ammunition and explosives. Outline requirements for explosive mishap investigations, malfunctions or mishaps reporting of all Class V materiel as addressed in references (a) through (w) aboard the Combat Center.

# 3. Execution.

### a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

- (1) <u>Commander's Intent</u>. Commanding Officers (COs), Directors, and Officers In-Charge will ensure compliance and issue amplifying instructions concerning this directive as appropriate.
- (2) <u>Concept of Operations</u>. Class V materiel will be managed, controlled, handled, stored, and transported per this manual, enclosure (1).

# b. <u>Coordinating Instructions</u>.

- (1) COs, Directors, and Officers-In-Charge will use this Standard Operating Procedure as appropriate to manage, handle, store, and transport Class V materiel.
- (2) Recommendations concerning the contents of this Order are invited. Such recommendations will be forwarded to the Commanding General, MAGTFTC, MCAGCC, (Attn: Explosives Safety Officer) via the chain of command.

#### 5. Command and Signal.

- a. <u>Command</u>. This Order is applicable to all military personnel, civilian employees, and operating forces while aboard the Combat Center.
