## Mission:

**MAGFTFC:** Conducts advanced individual and collective warfighting training, and manages the Commandant's Service Level Training Program (SLTP) in order to enhance the combat readiness of the Marine Air Ground Task Force (MAGTF) and support the Service's responsibilities to National Security.

**MCAGCC:** Supports MAGFTFC through logistics and service support activities, and provides a standard of excellence in infrastructure in order to ensure the readiness of tenant and resident commands aboard the Combat Center and Marine Corps Mountain Warfare Training Center.

## Tenets:

### Enhance combat readiness and lethality across the MAGTF

- Provide premier training venue for MAGTFs to rehearse fully integrated, combined arms and maneuver warfare to gain advantages across all domains
- Assess, standardize and codify techniques, tactics and procedures (TTPs)
- Assist units at all levels in identifying and managing risk
- Tailor training based off individual unit mission analysis, readiness and force generation cycle
- Adapt and update TTPs, concepts and doctrine to rapidly evolving modern battlefield
- End state: MAGTFs prepared to defeat enemies across the range of military operations

  - Holding our standards in training and garrison equates to how we fight in combat

  - Provide quality instruction through preparation and rehearsal

  - Anticipate requirements to avoid unnecessary pitfalls and mistakes
  - Display sturdy professionalism consistent with our leadership principles and traits
