LIBERTY MILITARY HOUSING

Dear MCAGCC Family Housing residents; in accordance with the National Defense Authorization Act 2020, the Marine Corps is directed to inspect 100% of individual Family Housing homes to assess the structural integrity, habitability, and establish the overall condition of the homes. The entire inventory of 2,210 homes aboard MCAGCC will be inspected (Adobe Flats I, Adobe Flats II, Adobe Flats III, Adobe Flats IV, Adobe Flats V, Desert View Terrace, Sunflower Terrace, Shadow Mountain, Copper Canyon, Joshua Heights, Marine Palms, Ocotillo Heights, Fairway Heights, Aztec, Two Mile, and Joe Davis communities).

These inspections will be conducted by Jacobs/HOR Joint Venture (JV), a third-party contractor, and are scheduled to begin during the week of November 27, 2023, and continue until 24 May 2024.

A reminder inspection date notice will also be emailed three weeks and one week prior to your inspection by the Military Housing Office (MHO) and a doorknob hanger notice will be left by Jacobs/HOR JV on your door twenty-four hours before your inspection. SHARED DRIVE BEING DECOMMISSIONED

MCEN Shared Drive ([\\mcuspndlfs43](#)) is being terminated 31 December 2023. This means all files that remain after this date will be deleted and unrecoverable. Per MARADMIN 112/23 Preparatory Guidance for Marine Corps Enterprise Network (MCEN) Unclassified Network Share Drive Migration, organizations and individuals who utilize unclassified Marine Corps Enterprise Network (MCEN) share drive services are required to migrate files and content to the unclassified cloud-based file storage, which includes Microsoft 365 (M365) OneDrive and collaborative capabilities such as Microsoft Teams or SharePoint Online (SPO). The "Shared Drive" includes not only the organization shared drive, but your personal network H:\ drive, also known as your CAC drive. When migrating content and files, ensure the proper safeguarding of sensitive data/ files to include all data/ files with PII or PHI. Assistance with any permissions requirements or content migration to support the execution of this effort can be directed to your organizational information management representative.

UPDATE TO INSTALLATION ACCESS PROCEDURES

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY, all individuals accessing MAGTF, MCAGCC must present valid acceptable identification, with 100% verification by PMO for every vehicle occupant. Between 0530 and 2000, DoD ID holders can use the Trusted Traveler process for up to 5 occupants/guests, those occupants need to present valid ID at the gate. Outside these hours, visitor passes must be obtained at the Main Gate.

Note: Holders of the Veterans Health Identification Card (VHIC) cannot sponsor or use the Trusted Traveler program unless they have an approved caretaker. Foreign nationals are not authorized to use the Trusted Traveler process for access. The Safety Office In an effort to help bring attention to suicide prevention and mental health awareness has created informational guidance in order to help break the stigma surrounding mental health and reach those that may be struggling throughout or military community. Please remember you are not alone!

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY AWARENESS

Motorcyclist safety should be on everyone's mind when driving a vehicle or the motorcycle. Between June 2023 and mid-September 2023, Navy and Marine Corps motorcycle fatalities more than doubled from 11 to 28. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, motorcyclists are 28 times more like to die in a crash than other motorists on the road. SPEED KILLS. Riders, take these brutal mishaps to heart. Every one of these deaths was needless and completely avoidable. Most fatalities are driven by high speeds and foolish decisions. If you want to be less than 10 to 28 times more likely to die, then don't speed, weave through traffic, or run from the police. If you skip those three things, your chances of staying alive go way up. COVID BOOSTER

NAVAL HOSPITAL TWENTYNINE PALMS VACCINE INFORMATION UPDATE:

Naval Hospital Twentynine Palms is offering the Pfizer bivalent COVID-19 vaccine to eligible beneficiaries 6 months-4 years of age. **Vaccines available by appointment only** in the hospital, **Clinic D**, Mon-Fri 8 a.m.-3:30 p.m. To make an appointment, call (760) 830-2654. If unable to reach a staff member at the above number, please leave a detailed voicemail for a return call.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends children aged **6 months–4 years** who completed 2 doses of the Pfizer primary series get an updated (bivalent) Pfizer 3rd dose at least 2 months after the 2nd dose. Children 6 months to 4 years who have already completed the Pfizer three dose primary series are not recommended to repeat the third primary series dose using the Pfizer bivalent vaccine.
