Prevention Measures

- Always secure your keys in your pocket or purse...
- Use a bright key chain to have better visual of keys...
- Ensure keys are in hand before locking the vehicle...
- Create good habits and check your key's location...
- Maintain a spare key and keep it in a secure place...
- Use key tracking technology and for opening the car...

Overall, the primary goal of a lockout is to prevent them if at all possible and eliminate suspicious or criminal behavior.

What to DO

- Keep locksmith's phone number on hand...
- Retrieve a spare key, if handy...

- Do NOT leave windows cracked to the point anyone can get in...
 - Do NOT attempt any type of entry that could lead to personal injury...
