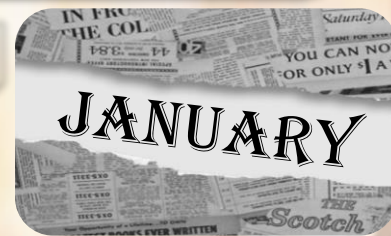

January 2024 brings focus on **Aggressive Driving.**

Every year aggressive driving behaviors, otherwise known as *road rage* create unnecessary problems causing dangerous driving that disregards safety of others. Here are five tips to prevent road rage:

FAILING TO SIGNAL – Purpose of turn signals is to provide intent of movement & failing to do so may result in accidents.

ALWAYS USE SIGNALS!!

TAILGATING – Don't drive too close to the vehicle in front of you to prevent accidents.

ALWAYS ALLOW SPACE!!

SPEEDING – Posted speed limits exist for a reason & failing to obey them endangers yourself & others.

ALWAYS GO SPEED LIMIT!!

CUTTING OFF – Rushed lane changes with not looking around can lead to accidents & you must avoid this behavior at all costs.

ALWAYS LOOK AROUND!!
