March 2024 brings focus on Vehicle Impoundment.

The impoundment of a vehicle can be a nightmare for drivers, which can lead to stress, financial burdens, and/or legal complications. Impoundment can happen for various reasons. Below are some reasons with best mitigation strategies:



If left with no other licensed driver after an apprehension, which is best prevented by following all mandated laws & traffic regulations.

If leaking oil, gas, or any hazardous material(s), which is best avoided by preventative care & maintenance.



If parked blocking driveways or refusing to move, which is best prevented by proper parking, staying compliant & keeping current contact information available.

If parked anywhere that suggest abandonment, which is best avoided by using approved long-term parking.





If left to impede traffic, block fire lanes, hydrants, or other firefighting equipment, which is resolved by assessing the area prior to parking.

Other reasons could lead to vehicle impoundment such as a DUI or driving while suspended or revoked. Do your part to follow rules, regulations & guidelines, park in proper areas & avoid leaving your vehicle where it does not belong.
