Subj: SOLID WASTE RECYCLING COLLECTION LOCAL

Ref: (a) CCO 5090.5D, Integrated Contingency and Operations Plan  
(b) Installation Integrated Solid Waste Management Plan

1. Purpose. This document provides environmental protection guidelines for the accumulation of solid waste and recycling materials for collection.

2. Application. This guidance applies to those personnel preparing solid waste and recyclable materials for collection aboard Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command (MAGTFTC), Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC) Twentynine Palms. For further references to MAGTFTC, MCAGCC in this document, the term installation will be used.

3. Procedures. Collection of solid waste must be performed in a safe efficient manner. Collection methods must prevent fires, safety hazards, pest harborage and disease carrying vectors. Activities must ensure that only solid wastes and other locally approved waste streams are disposed of in solid waste containers. Prohibited wastes include but are not limited to, household hazardous waste, hazardous waste, asbestos, medical waste, and recyclable materials.

Local requirements may prohibit the disposal of bulky items, pallets, and construction debris in solid waste containers. The installation utilizes trash can receptacles, recyclable can receptacles, dumpsters, and roll-off receptacles for non-hazardous solid waste.

4. Operational Controls. The following controls apply:

- a. Containers that collect food waste must be emptied at least weekly to reduce pest harborage and disease transmission.
- b. Trash containers/dumpsters; with the exception of those in office spaces, must have lids on them that are closed unless when adding trash in order to prevent pests from entering containers and to contain trash and debris.
- c. Trash containers/dumpsters in areas that may come into contact with precipitation must be kept closed to prevent storm water contamination. Ensure that the drain plugs are in place on the dumpster.
- d. Trash containers must be in good serviceable condition.
- e. All trash collection areas must be inspected and policed daily by unit personnel.

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- f. Recyclable material must be placed in the appropriately placarded recyclable collection containers, mixed recycling, or cardboard/paper dumpsters, etc.
- g. Whenever possible waste containers must be placed at a minimum of 50 feet from occupied buildings to reduce fire hazards and pest infestation/disease-carrying vector problems.
- h. Disposal of liquids in solid waste containers is prohibited.
- i. Disposal of hazardous material and hazardous waste in trash or recycling containers is prohibited. These materials should be turned into the Hazardous Waste Management Branch (HWMB), Bldg. 2095 Rifle Range Road for proper disposal.
- j. Disposal of ammunition/ordnance in a solid waste dumpster is prohibited.
- k. Disposal of material presenting potential of an explosive hazard, (i.e., ordnance, range residue, trash, ordnance related/packaging material taken off the range) is strictly prohibited. These items must be taken to the Range Sustainment Branch (RSB), located at Bldg. 2096 Rifle Range Road for inspection/screening. The RSB will make the determination as to the proper disposition or demilitarization of said range residue.
- l. Disposal of pressurized containers, such as aerosol cans, in solid waste containers is not permitted.
- m. Tires are not permitted to be disposed of in a solid waste dumpster. Coordination must be made with the Defense Logistics Agency for the proper disposal or recycling of Used Tires. Commands that generate this waste stream must contact their Supply Activity for further instruction pertaining to this requirement.
- n. Un-activated MRE heaters is a reactive hazardous material. MRE heaters must be deactivated before they can be classified as non-hazardous solid waste. All unactuated MRE Heaters must be turned into the HWMB for proper disposal.
- o. Bulky materials and metal items will not be placed in or around dumpsters but should be turned in as scrap to the installation Qualified Recycling Program (QRP), located at Bldg. 2085 Rifle Range Road.
- p. Parking of vehicles or the placing of objects in front of a solid waste dumpster in a manner that would deny access to this container is prohibited.

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5. Documentation and Record Keeping. There is no required record keeping for this ESOP.

6. Training. All affected personnel must be trained in this document and the following:

General Environmental Awareness training.

7. Emergency Preparedness and Response Procedures. Refer to reference (a) and spill response procedures listed in the Abatement ESOP.

8. Inspection and Corrective Action. There are no inspection requirements for this ESOP.
