ACE Compound



The Air Combat Element compound has nine K-Spans for ACE operations; each with limited power and lights, and wired for DSN phone lines and the Marine Corps Enterprise Network.

Aid Station

Bldg 5424, a standard K-Span with climate control, lights and limited power, is available for use as a consolidated aid station.

Armory Compound



The armory compound has 16 portable armory units with intrusion detection system.

Billeting K-Spans

Numerous billeting K-Spans are available. Each has 30 cots, lights and limited power.





Chapel

Chapel of the Desert, Bldg 5413, seats 200 people. It can be used for religious services and classroom instruction.



Communications Pedestals

The camp has 45 pedestals providing single-mode fiberoptic cable access to interconnect data networks to exercise forces. Designated



locations also provide garrison MCEN-N access and tactical DSN phone services.

Exercise Control Facility



The Exercise Control Facility has eight trailers for office space and classroom instruction, a motor pool and briefing center with unclassified videoteleconference capability. Reserve through the Range Facility Management Support System.

Expeditionary Energy Office

The Expeditionary Energy Office provides innovation for increased combat effectiveness.

Feeding Site

The Camp Wilson Expeditionary Field Feeding Site supports service-level training with mess attendant services where units can plug in their organic equipment. It also



serves as a ration receiving/issuing point.

Fire Department

The Combat Center Fire Department, Bldg 5419, provides all-hazard, all-risk fire, rescue and emergency medical services. For emergencies, call (760) 830-3333. Call box available when fire personnel are off-site.

Fuel Farm



The fuel farm features six commercial fuel tanks with 70,000-gallon capacity.

Heads

The camp has 23 heads. Each has eight showers and sinks, and six toilets.

HLZ

The Helicopter Landing Zone supports all Marine Corps rotary wing platforms.

Laundry

The laundry facility provides 27 commercial washers and 11 commercial dryers free of charge.



Loading Ramp



The loading ramp supports six tractor-trailer spaces.

MAGTF Compound



The Marine Air Ground Task Force (MAGTF) compound has five K-Spans dedicated for COC space. Each has limited power, lights, and is wired for DSN phone lines and data support for tactical systems.

Motor Pools/Vehicle Staging Areas



The camp has nine 7-acre motor pool lots for vehicle staging. Some have maintenance bays.

Outdoor Classroom



The outdoor classroom seats 800. It can be used for classes, ceremonies and other unit activities.

Trash Collection Point



The trash collection point accepts trash and recyclables. No range dunnage accepted.

Water Point



The potable water point is at the intersection of CW Alpha and Coyote Valley.
