# NREA gives county supervisor environmental tour

The Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs staff welcomed Brad Mitzelfelt, San Bernardino County First District supervisor, to the Combat Center Tuesday.

Mitzelfelt plays a major role in keeping the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors updated with environmental issues, and spent the day learning how NREA works to improve the environment at the base.

Brig. Gen. Melvin G. Spiese, Combat Center commanding general, was the first to welcome Mitzelfelt and his staff to the Combat Center before they started their tour.

After the-meet-and greet with Spiese, Brad Henen, NREA ecologist, led the tour to the Tortoise Research and

Captive Rearing Site at Combat Center Sand Hill Training Area and explained NREA's involvement with the threatened desert tortoises aboard the base.

The TRACRS is a facility dedicated to monitoring desert tortoise egg production and disease status using cutting edge technology.

The highly qualified staff of the Natural Resources Section involved with TRACRS helps by bringing female tortoises to the facility pens to lay their eggs.

The TRACRS protects the nests and baby tortoises through their growing stages until they are large enough to become resistant to predators such as ravens, coyotes and ground squirrels.

The genetic, growth and bacterial analyses will also help

# Lima Battery trains for non-lethal engagements

The Marines and sailors of Lima Battery, 3rd Battalion, 12th Marine Regiment, conducted non-lethal weapons training this week at Camp San Mateo, Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, Calif.

Lima Battery was trained by instructors from I Marine Expeditionary Force Special Operations Training Group in preparation for their upcoming deployment attached to the 31st Marine Expeditionary Unit in

"Right now, we're teaching them the basic skills," said Sgt. Robert Sanchez, I MEF SOTG instructor. "The Marines are learning strikes, takedowns and other non-lethal tactics to protect themselves and others in an operational environment."

The training began Monday when Lima Battery was taught

basic baton tactics, the use of coming out." lethal force, escalation of force, the rules of engagement, and unarmed strikes, blocks and takedowns.

Monday culminated with classes and practical application about Oleoresin Capsicum spray, a non-lethal chemical used to disorient an opponent. First, they practiced spraying techniques with practice spray against stationary, walking and running targets.

Larcenies have always been a big problem across the U.S. There has been an increasing problem of thefts aboard the base and especially in the barracks, which is an issue we have to strongly look at and find a way to address.

Out of the 72 larcenies, almost all of them could have been prevented or been a lot easier to solve if the person who had their property stolen would have secured the items properly, kept receipts of the merchandise or marked or engraved their property with a property marking for identification purposes. Also ensure that you write down and keep a record of all serial numbers and other identifiers of high dollar or sentimental merchandise and keep that list in a secure location. Most pawn shops will not take property that has property engraving markings on them.

# **Emergency Room Procedures Explained**

The Naval Hospital Twentynine Palms Emergency Room can be confusing and sometimes frustrating when receiving health care. Our staff will do everything we can to help answer any questions that you may have during your visit about our service.

We must prioritize patients so that the critical and life threatening illnesses are treated first. This may mean that less serious illnesses may not be seen in the order that they come in to the ER. We try very hard to keep the waiting time to a minimum, but wait time may vary with the number of illnesses that are being treated.

If you find that you need to bring yourself or a family member to our emergency service, here are some things that you can do that may improve your visit: Bring a list of medications and correct doses. If you don't know these, then bring the medications in with you. Be sure to let the triage nurse know of any allergies or significant medical problems that you may have. Have someone available to drive you home. Sometimes we give medications that don't allow you to drive.

Every patient is important to us! Every patient will receive attention as quickly as we can provide it. Our busiest times are evening hours, on week-

patients and the severity of the ends and holidays. To help you through your visit to the ER, here is an example of a typical visit: Check in at the ER Registration Desk. First and foremost we provide patient privacy at all times. If standing in line to check in, please allow the person in front of you privacy. The medical clerk will create a chart to document your visit. You will be asked why you are here and current address, phone and insurance information.

The triage nurse is the first health professional you will see. He or she will need descriptions of your illness, medications and allergies. Patients waiting for treatment will be prioritized by need, severity of symptoms and condition on presentation. The triage nurse can provide first Ship's Store located on the first aid supplies, such as Tylenol, Motrin, bandages, splints or ice packs if needed. Your blood pressure and temperature will be recorded at this time. You may be asked to provide a urine sample, visit radiology for x-ray imaging, or have a blood sample drawn during this phase of your visit. Following this initial evaluation of your injury or illness, you will be directed to the appropriate waiting area.

The hospital's ER will try to minimize the time spent in the waiting area. Your comfort, while waiting, is important to us. We ask that you refrain from eating or drinking while awaiting treatment. Those accompanying you are welcome to use the hospital's floor. If you wish to inquire about the status of a patient, please check with the front desk clerk. The staff will be happy to provide you updated information.

As soon as possible, you will be called and taken to a room in the ER for an appropriate evaluation and treatment of vour problem.

A health care provider will perform a physical examination. If injury or illness requires a specialist, one will be consulted to aid in your evaluation. The ER at times can be very busy and crowded. We ask that only one support person accompany patients to help protect privacy.

If your problem does not require hospital admission, you will be discharged from the ER. Written instructions detailing home care procedures will be explained by a health care professional and given to you. Please do not hesitate to ask questions regarding your concerns. At, or before discharge you may receive a follow-up referral or prescription for medication. **Appropriate** actions to facilitate either will be explained by a health care professional. The hospital's pharmacy is located on the first floor, across form Radiology department.

Feel free to offer comments to the Emergency Medicine Department's Customer Service Representative if you have any concerns or would just like to offer your appreciation for the service you were provided.

honing their new-found skills and rehearsing different crowd control scenarios in preparation for the final day of training.

Lima Battery completed their training by using the skills they learned throughout the week to diffuse a mock riot. Everything they were taught had to be applied in order to take control of the situation.

The battery returned to the Combat Center, following four days of intense training. Overall, the Marines seemed satisfied and were glad to have completed the course.

"It's a good thing we did this," said Cpl. James Noles, motor transport operator. "If I never went through this, I wouldn't know what it's like. I might use too much force on someone during a real life

scenario."

Both experienced Marines and those new to the battery feel positive about the training they are receiving.

"The training's actually pretty sweet," said Cpl. Greg Panella, section chief. "It's good we're getting it because we're going to the Pacific Rim, which has a lot of instability. We may have to put this training to use there."

For many Marines in the battery, this will be their first deployment.

"I'm pretty excited to deploy for the first time," said canoneer Rasmussen, an artilleryman. "I hope we get to use this training while we're over there.

Rasmussen added he came to the battery approximately one month ago and has been in the field most of the time.

After a much-deserved weekend of rest, Lima Battery will return to the field to conduct artillery operations with their MEU counterpart, Battalion Landing Team 2/4. The battery will provide essential indirect fire support to BLT 2/4 during upcoming training scenarios and in the operational environment while deployed.

Lima Battery will continue to train before deploying as part of the 31st MEU in January to Okinawa, Japan. Their newly-acquired nonlethal training and tactics will help defend themselves and others in the operational environment they may face in the future

# 'Alpha dog' aims to work Wolfpack out of job

COMBAT OUTPOST RAWAH, Iraq, -- Traditionally throughout history, wolves are feared and respected, and are the subject of numerous myths from the Norse god Fenrir (the wolf destined to bring the end of the world), to werewolves, to the children's stories Little Red Riding Hood and The Three Little Pigs.

In Iraq's western Anbar Province, the legend of the wolf lives on as 3rd Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion returns to the western Euphrates River valley surrounding Rawah and Anah in support of Regimental Combat Team 2.

The sight of a company of 3rd LAR's light armored vehicles speeding across the desert sands, kicking up a massive dust trail as they sweep from cliff to valley to hill, easily conjures an explanation for their nickname, the Wolfpack.

This year marks the Wolfpack's fourth deployment in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, and their second trip to the Rawah area in western al Anbar Province. The battalion wasted no time upon arriving and jumped right into Operation Mawtini III.

"This operation is really a series of smaller operations that cover our entire area of operation," explained Lt. Col. James R. Parrington, the battalion's commanding officer. "The purpose is to disrupt enemy activity and improvised explosive device cells, disrupt and dissuade suicide bombers, and find weapons."

The battalion 'alpha dog' went on to say the regimental-wide operation is geared toward preventing the insurgents who were driven from the cities by the regiment from entering them again.

"The cities, though not perfect, are getting a secure environment which allows the government to grow. We're trying to maintain that security and that progress," said Parrington, a Minneapolis native.

Comanche Company played a large role in the Wolfpack's desert operations, and recently swept through one of the desert's dried up wadi (oases) systems, now just a series of large barren riverbeds, caves and cliffs.

"Basically, Comanche was tasked with going out to the open desert to hunt insurgents because most of them have been driven out of the towns and cities due to the successful joint operations with the Iraqi Security Forces," said Sgt. Jesse R. Walden, a squad leader with the company.

Walden, a Muskogee, Okla., native went on to say the company was expected to interdict insurgents trying to cross the desert, and discover and destroy caches and other illegal materials

"We've been looking for Woodburn, Oreg., native.

caches and insurgents who may be using the old wadi as a way to avoid coalition or Iraqi forces," said Lance Cpl. Mark Efimoff, a squad automatic weapon gunner with the company. "I think the mission was a success, we came out looking for stuff, and we found it."

The company found nearly a half dozen AK-47s, 15 fully loaded AK-47 magazines, two cases of 10-gage shotgun flares, and two ammunition cans of 7.62 mm rounds.

Comanche accompanied a local Provincial Security Force on the sweep through the barren wadi. The Marines said they were a little surprised by the Iraqi Police who make up the special force.

"I guess the PSF are like a sheriffs department in the U.S.," explained Walden. "Compared to two years ago, you can tell the joint security operations like this are working much better, regardless of the reports you hear abut random and sporadic attacks."

"I heard a lot of good things about the PSF before we went out with them. They don't have the Marine Corps military discipline, but their hearts are in the right place and they're trying to accomplish the same mission we are," said Efimoff, a Woodburn Oreg native

While sweeping through the old wadi, the PSF found a tent with (14) 25-pound bags of homemade explosive, a rocket, and a large supply of detonation cord.

"The PSF is a pretty good organization," said Parrington, a veteran of Desert Shield, Desert Storm, and Operation Enduring Freedom. "The (Iraqi Security Forces) in this area are doing great. The police are policing, the soldiers are doing what soldiers do. The Iraqi Army, Police, and PSF can all lay claim to the success here because they were all here long before us. I would characterize their contribution as significant and their performance as exceptional.'

The Wolfpack commander said he looks forward to the day when U.S. forces are no longer needed in Iraq, and he is making sure his battalion does everything they can to contribute to provincial Iraqi control.

"I'd like to work us out of a job," laughed the 21-year Marine Corps veteran. "I'd like to see the Iraqi Army in control of the battlespace, the police in complete control of the towns, and rule of law firmly established, so criminals can be tried and convicted. That's my goal, to work us out of a job."

winners were recognized.

The third match for record was the grand aggregate. All four days of rifle and pistol scores were added together per competitor with first, second and third place recognized.

The rifle team match consisted of four competitors from the same unit. Scores within the team are added together with a maximum score of 1,000. Only the first place team was recognized.

The pistol team match was scored the same as the rifle team match with a maximum score of 1,600.

The last match for the competition was the combat infantry trophy team match. Each team consisted of three competitors from the same unit engaging four targets. There were 192 rounds distributed per team. The teams fired from the 500, 300, 200 and 100-yard line with a sense of urgency. Only first place was recognized.

"I am confident all Marines who participated in these matches have a much stronger grasp of the fundamentals of rifle and pistol marksmanship," said Bickle. "It is the foundations of these matches, sending back a better product than what we received therefore, spreading the knowledge and skills to your unit which subsequently can only enhance results dur-

According to Capt. Kenneth Walden, VMU-1's logistics officer, the competition is a great way for units to become closer and teach junior Marines rifle marksmanship.

"I don't keep track of how I am doing," said Walden. "My goal was to push my team to shoot better."

Walden scored first place for the individual pistol match and first place for grand aggregate.

"I think the competition is a good idea because it builds a base of training for the units," said Walden.

MCCES walked away with the most team awards, winning first place for individual rifle, rifle team match, infantry trophy team match and pistol team match.

"To drive home the importance of precision shooting, I tell you this: The base intramural program basically involves precision sports," said Bickle. "Whether it is golf, basketball, bowling or shooting, it is a precision sport. It obviously is difficult to shoot a little 5.56 mm bullet 500 yards and hit the center of a small target frame. So, we need to ask ourselves, has an enemy combatant ever been killed by a basketball or golf ball....probably not. But an enemy combatant has been killed by a well trained Marine shooting a precision shot."



# Band Sergeant still in tune with instruments of war

HIT, Iraq -- When Commandant Gen. James T. Conway published All Marine Message 002/07, 'Every Marine into the fight, Jan. 23, 2007, he gave an oboe player with the Marine band at Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Center an opportunity he thought would never materialize.

Sgt. Regan Young joined the Marine Corps during 2004 with an open contract in the hopes of seeing the world and experiencing life outside of Arlington, Va., where he was born and raised. However, he ended up with a military occupational specialty, that is rarely deployed, because oboe players are so rare in the Marine Corps, it doesn't get the opportunity to deploy with the rest of the band.

"I didn't join the Marine Corps to go in the band," said the 21-year -old. "I had done that my whole life and wanted something new under my belt."

Young began playing the oboe at Yorktown High School and found he was excellent at it. He said his love for the instrument is one he will always have, but wanted it as a passion, not a job.

"My recruiter knew I played the oboe," he said. "During the first

phase of boot camp, we were practicing for initial drill and I got called out and there was a recruiter, my senior drill instructor and all my chain of command. They started asking me questions about what I played and how long I have been playing. Once I auditioned, they told me I was going to be in the band. I didn't really have a choice. It wasn't as if I didn't want

to do it, I just wanted to do something else.'

Then Young's chance arrived when the commandant said no Marine would be held back from answering their nation's call. After reading the message, Young immediately put in an administrative action form requesting to go forward.

"After I put in my AA form, I

would literally bug my company commander two to three times a day," said Young. "He was all about Marines deploying and really helped push to get me here. I later learned it may not have been the AA form that got me here, but after six months of bugging the right people and just constant persistence, the powers that be said, 'Fine if this is what you want, we are going to give it to you."

Now, Young is the assistant camp commandant and police sergeant with 1st Battalion, 7th Marine Regiment, serving in Hit, Iraq. He said the Marines he works with understand how hard he fought, so they bring him out on missions with them.

"It is everything I imagined," said Young. "I love interacting with the people, seeing a different culture. Being deployed with an infantry battalion is letting me get a taste of the Marine Corps I never would have had the opportunity to see, and I don't plan on wasting it."

Young plans on returning to the band when he returns to the States. He wants to perfect his saxophone skills he has learned since joining.

"I burned some bridges, but I think that was only people who took it personally and felt like I didn't want to be with them in the band. But, what it was is I just wanted to do something different, said Young. "If I could be in any band, it would be the Marine Corps Band, I just don't think people join the Marine Corps to play music, that wasn't my intent. I love the Marine Corps and have had a great career so far. I think it is only going to get better. But, I am never happy staying with one thing, that is why this job is so great for me."

in the assessment of the Combat Center population, according to the TRACRS information sheet.

"The TRACRS program is such an effective way to save desert tortoises on base that the county would like to implement on private property," said Metzelfelt. "It was very nice to get an opportunity to see it first-hand.'

Henen also explained the NREA involvement with Marines in case of direct contact with desert tortoises.

"The main focus is to keep the tortoises in the local area, but Marines occasionally encounter them in the training area," said Henen. "Every Marine who enters the training area is made aware of the proper steps to take when they spot a tortoise.'

After the informational walkthrough of TRACRS, the tour moved on to the Range Residue Processing Center to learn about the recycling process.

Mike Quintana, RRRC supervisor, explained how used ammunition and materials from the Combat Center training area are reused.

"I was very impressed by the base's recycling programs,' said Mitzelfelt. "It's good to see the base takes recycling very seriously and they're doing well.'

Mitzelfelt and his staff moved from the RRRC to learn about the base's progress with residential recycling from Corney, Qualified Recycling Program manager.

"We're working to establish a recycling center on the base so Marines and their families don't have to go out into town to receive cash value for their recyclable items," said Jim Lessard, NREA deputy director.

The NREA staff thoroughly informed Mitzelfelt of desert tortoise protection and recycling to give the county supervisor a better understanding of the steps being taken to improve the Combat Center environment.

## The 29 Palms Historical **Society Annual Weed Show:**

## 25 years of Preserving Our History, Nov. 3-4

TWENTYNINE PALMS HISTORICAL SOCIETY

It's time again for the Twentynine Palms Historical Society's Annual Weed Show. So, take a dose of antihistamine if you need to, but find your way to the Old Schoolhouse Museum during the first weekend in November.

The theme for 2007, 25 years of Preserving Our History, is in recognition of the 25th anniversary of the founding of the Twentynine Palms Historical Society.

The Weed Show is a unique art show that highlights the plants and artifacts of desert living, as artists transform the mundane to the beautiful.

All works are original, and fit within categories that are designed to challenge the creativity of the artists while highlighting activities, people, and things that make the desert a unique and forbidding, yet lovely place.

The Weed Show origins life in an off-hand comment by artist Mildred Bryant Brooks to members of the Women's Club, who had helped establish a Twentynine Palms tradition that has endured for more than 60 years.

Brooks, a renowned artist in her time, was visiting to lecture on the art of etching in the summer of 1940. The ladies of the Women's Club were chagrined that they could not present their esteemed guest with a bouquet of fresh flowers- as good etiquette dictated-due to the shortage of green or flowering vegetation in the hot summer. Brooks' remark, that the desert had so many beautiful weeds that flowers were unnecessary, inspired the club members to establish the first ever Weed Show in 1941. The categories have changed very little since that first Weed Show in 1941, and still include a range of accessories from junk to beautiful purple glass.

In celebration of the Twentynine Palms Historical Society's silver anniversary, silver has replaced the traditional purple glass for this year. Since purple glass is such a recognizable icon of desert life, and has come to be figure so prominently in Weed Show display, participants are encouraged to showcase their purple glass pieces; the silver and purple complement each other nicely.

In addition to celebrating the return of the Weed Show, the Old School House Museum is celebrating a major expansion that nearly doubled the available space in the museum. The new facilities include a temperature and humidity controlled curation room, a library, and office space, which has allowed the museum to return the original schoolroom to an authentic state.

Come and celebrate 25 years with the Twentynine Palms Historical Society and the Old Schoolhouse Museum on Nov. 3 and 4.

#### **RULES TO ENTER**

- 1. Read the Rules for Exhibitors and sign the Exhibitor Agreement Form.
- 2. You may submit only one entry per category.
- 3. You may enter as many categories as you wish.
- 4. Prior to acceptance, our Weed Show Committee will review your entry, which will be examined to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations, and will assist you in classifying your entry.

#### **RULES FOR EXHIBITORS**

- 1. Your entry must be complete and ready for display when you enter the Museum to register. There is no workroom at the Museum for exhibit assem-
- 2. All compositions must contain a desert plant (it is a weed show).
- 3. Arrangements may use any type of fresh plant material.
- 4. Plant material must be in its natural state.
- 5. Entries for all categories may only be held together with natural adhesives, i.e. clay, sand or sap. Hot glue, oasis foam or similar materials are not allowed. Exception: you may use glue for Category 2. This exception applies to this
- 6. The base used for your entry must be solid enough to permit handling by a committee member. Only committee members will move displays. Construction paper may be used to complement the entry.
- 7. No artificial plants are allowed.
- 8. Space is limited. For exhibition inside the Museum, keep entries smaller than 20" wide x 16" deep x 36" high. Larger entries will automatically go into the oversize category (#7) to be staged outside and will be unattended.
- 9. Each entry will be judged not only for artistry but also for its adherence to the criteria of the category, i.e. subject matter, use of accessory, being within the specified dimensions, use of plant material. Each entry must be strong enough to withstand the elements.

Entries must be brought to the Museum between the hours of 4 and 6:30 p.m. on Nov. 2 or Nov. 3 from 7 to 9:30 a.m. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. Judging is from 9:30 a.m. to noon on Saturday. Pick up entries on Sunday, Nov. 4 from 4 to 5 p.m. The Twentynine Palms Historical Society is not responsible for loss, damage or any unclaimed entries.

#### **CATEGORIES**

#### 1. Silver:

917

1. Museum quality silver container for arrangement. Fresh plant material ONLY may be used in this category.

2. Less than museum quality silver must be used as an accessory for the composition. Composition means dried vegetation alone or in combination with fresh plant material.

#### 2. Ice House/Civic Center

A shadow box is the accessory to be used for a composition representing a museum display. Glue may be used for this category ONLY. (See Rules for Exhibitors,

#### 3. Acquiring/Moving

One Foot at a Time represents the acquisition/fundraising for land. Overall size of 6" x 6" x 6"

Baby Steps represents the move with such accessories as trucks, band instruments, cheering crowds, patrol officers. Overall size of 3" x 3" x 3"

#### 4. Weed Show

1. Museum quality purple glass for arrangement. Fresh plant material ONLY may be used in this category.

2. Broken purple glass must be used as an accessory for the composition. This means dried vegetation alone or in combination with fresh plant material.

#### 5. Renovation

Accessories with this composition should be small construction items.

#### 6. Bricks and Mortar

This category represents the flagpole and the inscribed surrounding bricks at the Twentynine Palms Historical Society. The composition may include flags, bricks, hod carriers.

#### 7. Expansion

All exhibits larger than 20" wide by 16" deep by 36" high. Display items will be outside the Museum building and unattended. Any accessory is permitted including models or drawings.

#### 8. Windmills (for children only)

Composition using windmills or representation.

- 1. Ages four to eight
- 2. Ages nine to twelve






