VFW supports troops deploying, returning home

Whenever a unit leaves or returns from a deployment, support for them comes in a variety of ways, and is aimed at taking care of them and boosting their morale.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars take each deployment to heart by providing deploying and returning units with invaluable support.

The VFW provides refreshments, phones and internet service to the units from every branch of the armed forces traveling through March Air Reserve Base, Calif. There are a total of 50 cellular phones and six laptop computers with internet available for the troops at March ARB.

"These guys are never far from our hearts," said Jim Kokas, military assistance director for the California VFW. "The VFW's been where they've been. We'll be here until the last man comes home."

"Some of these volunteers drive a long way to be here for these guys," he added.

The VFW works hand-in-hand with March ARB to provide these services to the troops. A chance for them to relax, grab a bite to eat and

communicate with loved ones is something the VFW knows is important for morale.

Laura Froelich, family support volunteer coordinator at March ARB, is in charge of coordinating the support efforts there and raises funding for the program through the Military Affairs Committee of the Moreno Valley Chamber of

Commerce. She said she started the program for personal reasons.

"When my father came back from Vietnam in the 1970s, he was spat on," she said. "I decided that in my corner of the world, where I have control, no one would ever feel the way he did again."

"I've been doing this for

five years," added Froelich. "Since the start of the war, I think I've only missed five homecomings."

Froelich has been working at March ARB for 21 years. She started a similar program during Operation Desert Storm in 1991.

Last week, 3rd Battalion, 7th Marine Regiment, returned

from a seven-month deployment to Iraq. As usual, Froelich and the VFW volunteers were there to greet them when they stepped off the planes at March ARB.

"I'm real appreciative of the people who come out and support us," said 1st Sgt. Elvis

A day in the life of a Combat Center Firefighter

The date was Nov. 19. I arrive at the Combat Center Fire Department at 7:30 a.m. I'm greeted by several firefighters as I enter the garage. I've worked with some of the firefighters in the past regarding other stories I've published.

Firefighter Brent Gregory shows me to the bunkhouse. He's not working today, so I'll be staying in his living space tonight. I put my stuff down and rejoin the crew.

Now, its 8 a.m. and time for the oncoming crew's morning muster. I join them in the lounge for their morning briefing from Assistant Fire Chief Kevin P. Mathieu.

After detailing the plan of the day, Mathieu introduces me to the crew. Knowing that printing a firefighter's picture in the paper will cost him a gallon of ice cream, I'm relatively nervous to be spending the next 24 hours with these guys. Fortunately for me, they're a friendly group.

As soon as the muster ends, the crew boards the vehicles and heads to the CCFD training area on Del

Valle Road. Today, they're going to be conducting an obstacle course wearing hazardous material suits. First to suit up and complete the course is Fire Captain Dennis Fleming.

Fleming gets through the course with relative ease, although the insulation inside the HAZMAT suit has him drenched in sweat. The outcome was similar for the other firefighters who went through the course.

After the course, I go to lunch at Desert Winds Golf Course with some of the guys. The hot topic is sports, primarily football, which I know little about. I'm a baseball fan. One of the guys, Firefighter Patrick Perez, happens to be a die-hard Boston Red Sox fan. This worked out great for me. I've loved that team my whole life. We talk about how awesome the Sox played this year and what we hope to see from them next season.

The afternoon was spent cleaning up the gear from the HAZMAT obstacle course. The suits were washed, and the rest of the gear was cleaned and reorganized. I helped out as much as I could, but with everyone else hard at

work, there wasn't a lot left for me to do.

Dinner was a real treat. Every night, one or more members of the crew cook dinner for everyone else. Tonight, Fleming was scheduled to cook. He prepared a delicious pork roast, mashed potatoes, corn and salad. We also had some store-bought Hawaiian sweet rolls that were really good.

"Dinner is a tradition," said Firefighter Jason Swift. "We cook together, we eat together, we fight fires together – this is a brotherhood."

At dinner, the crew swapped anecdotes and talked about work. It had been a slow day. Not a single call so far. They all told me this time of year was really slow. They get a lot more calls during the summer.

Everyone sat around and relaxed after dinner. By now, I had broken out of my natural shyness and started striking up conversation with the crew. They told me a lot about their past experiences as firefighters. I've been considering becoming a firefighter for a while and the stories these guys were telling me was only

Larcenies have always been a big problem across the U.S. There has been an increasing problem of thefts aboard the base and especially in the barracks, which is an issue we have to strongly look at and find a way to address.

Out of the 79 larcenies, almost all of them could have been prevented or been a lot easier to solve if the person who had their property stolen would have secured the items properly, kept receipts of the merchandise or marked or engraved their property with a property marking for identification purposes. Also ensure that you write down and keep a record of all serial numbers and other identifiers of high dollar or sentimental merchandise and keep that list in a secure location. Most pawn shops will not take property that has property engraving markings on them.

Marine Corps launches SNCO Evening Dress Uniform survey

MARINE CORPS SYSTEMS COMMAND

MARINE CORPS SYSTEMS COMMAND, QUANTICO, Va. – Marine Corps Systems Command’s (MCSC) Program Manager for Infantry Combat Equipment (PM ICE) has initiated an Internet survey soliciting input from Marines on a proposed modification to the men’s Staff Noncommissioned Officer Evening Dress Uniform. All active, reserve, retired and for-

mer Marines are invited to participate in the quick and easy survey. According to the program office, the survey shouldn’t take longer than five minutes to complete. The proposed modification eliminates the bowtie and gives the evening dress jacket a standing collar with an open silhouette to provide a distinctive Marine Corps appearance apart from other services. The new design would increase the cost of the SNCO Evening Dress Uniform by approximately \$50.

Scheduled to conclude in three weeks, the survey results will help PM ICE improve the Evening Dress Uniform, make a final decision on the design, and determine the length of a phase-in period. 

Presidential Election Primary Dates

MARADMIN 638/07

The presidential election is scheduled for Nov. 4, 2008 and is approaching fast. Exercising your right to vote is an important part of being a responsible citizen.

As Marines, you have been fighting to ensure others have the same opportunities as you to elect your senior leaders. To vote, you must be properly registered. Now is the time for all eligible voters to ensure you are properly registered for the upcoming elections.

If you will be assigned or deployed outside of your home state, to vote in the primary or general election you and your accompanying family members must properly complete and submit a federal post card application (FPCA). The FPCA is the Department of Defense voting registration form that is accepted by all 50 states and its territories.

The FPCA allows you to: (1) register to vote in your state of legal residence, (2) change your mailing address with your state of legal residence and (3) request an absentee ballot. In order to ensure sufficient time for processing by your state, it is recommended that your FPCA be mailed 30-45 days prior to the date of the state election. If your state is one of those scheduled to have their primary election in January 2008, you should complete your FPCA now.

Your unit voting assistance officer is ready to assist you and your family members in completing the FPCA. Your UVAO can also be of great assistance in obtaining election information. Another source of information is the Marine Corps voting web page located at www.manpower.usmc.mil/voting

The Mojave Max Emergence

Contest campaign is designed to increase understanding about how desert ecosystems work and especially how the desert tortoise and other indigenous organisms are affected when ecosystem stability is undermined. Desert tortoises are California's state reptile; they are also listed on the endangered species list as threatened. When the weather turns cold, desert tortoises brumate—a reptilian form of hibernation. As the contest matures into a regional awareness campaign, it will increase opportunities for people of all ages to learn about the desert environment. Each year the contest gains more student participation and teacher support.

Haditha booming thanks to Marines of past, present

HADITHA, Iraq – It may be impossible to predict history as it is happening, but some of the battles fought in Iraq are certain to become legendary. Generations from now, school children will learn of the heroes who fought in Fallujah and Ramadi, battling in extreme conditions when their country needed them most. Haditha, another Anbar city once caught in the grip of yesterday's violence, is now becoming a city of progress and transition.

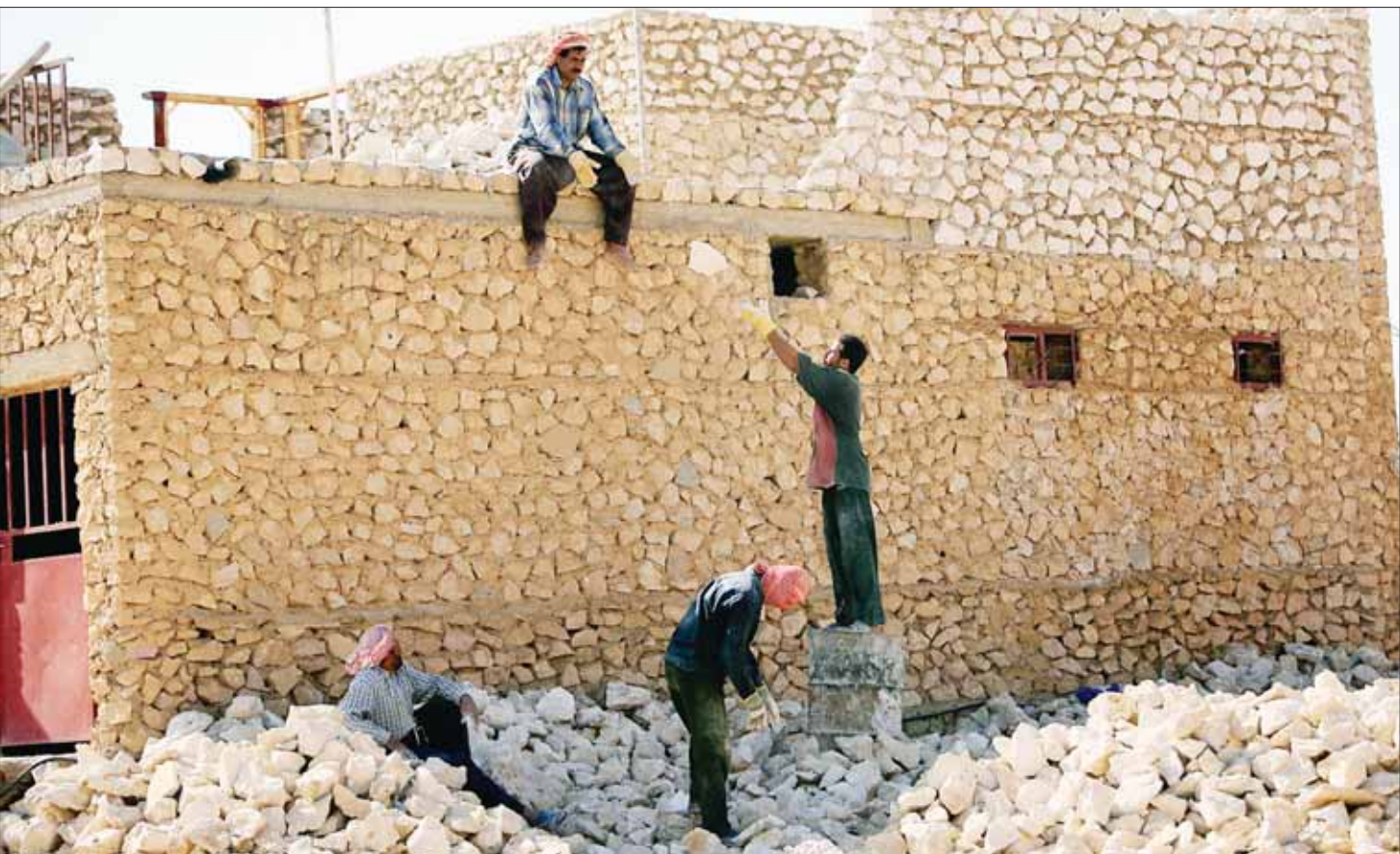
Without question, Haditha is known for its fierce battles. Many have given their lives in an attempt to reclaim peace in this northern area of the province. It was in this city that six Marines were killed in an ambush during 2005. Days later, 14 Marines died when

their armored vehicle was struck by a roadside bomb. The city was a hotbed for terrorists where Marines confronted their enemy in the streets, houses and farm lands. But, if there was ever a place that could paint the picture of the progress being made in Anbar, it's here.

A battalion of more than 1,000 Marines recently moved into Haditha. Most of them are reservists from New Orleans' 3rd Battalion, 23rd Marine Regiment. Others are attachments from Houston's 1st Bn., 23rd Marines, or active duty Marines from various commands throughout the Marine Corps. Regardless of where they came or their status, their mission is clear.

"The main effort now is continuing to train the Iraqi security forces so we can transition into Iraqi control," said Lt. Col. Kevin Jarrard, Company L commander.

Many parts of Anbar have already seen the transfer of command from coalition forces to Iraqi Army forces. Recently, the 7th Iraqi Army Division, the newest division in Iraq, took control of their area of operations, which includes Haditha. Marines here are getting ready to slow down operations and

assist their Iraqi counterparts. This is the focus for much of the Marines in Iraq. The days of house-to-house fighting seems to be a part of Anbar's past, making deployments of today much different from those just last year.

"A year ago, we were fighting in the streets every day,

(evacuating) Marines who were wounded in action," said Jarrard. "Now, the Marines patrol the streets and the people are talking about problems, which are nice problems to have. 'Hey, can we get the roads paved,' it sounds kind of like our neighborhoods back home. The problems are problems that every city has in the world. They're not the problems of a city in the midst of a civil war."

Haditha is located on the western edge of the Euphrates River, covered in palm trees and flat, green pastures. More than 70, 000 Iraqis call this city home. These days, it looks and feels like any other city; people here travel by taxi, walk the markets at dusk, cheer at local soccer matches on weekends and play in school yards during the day. The landscape is everything but a chaotic battlefield.

The problems no longer lie in the shadows or in suspicious vehicles, but rather in rebuilding mosques, getting the townspeople comfortable with their policemen, making sure fresh water runs to each home, turning a city devastated by bombs and bullets into a livable community for the people here. "It's not the normal kind of combat operations," said 1st Lt. Steven Dobb, the 1st platoon commander for Company L. "It's more of a peacekeeping role almost, because the insurgency is not

here anymore and what we are trying to do now is build a community."

Dobb's platoon patrols the northern end of the city, near the dam. His Marines walk the winding streets of Haditha's neighborhoods every day. They meet with locals, hand out supplies and get the Iraqi police comfortable with citizens of different tribes. The community is growing and the progress

going on to try and better this place."

The most evident sign of stability here lies just south of 1st platoon's outpost and the newly opened water treatment plant. Construction workers continuously move earth, swing hammers and lay rock, fashioning a neighborhood for Haditha's newest residents.

"With all the rebuilding going on south of us, it looks

is easy to see.

"The people here are trying to turn it around," said Lance Cpl. Michael Mathes, infantryman, 1st platoon, Company L. "Every day we come out here on patrol, we see them either trying to rebuild the streets or the sewer lines. They always have some kind of project

like the people want to keep the security up, want to keep this a safe place," said Dobb. "They feel safe enough to bring their families here and they're investing a lot of money into this place."

It is not easy to understand how far Haditha has come unless its past is understood. The sounds of bombs and mortars have been replaced by car horns and school children. The images of modern homes and open-air markets have replaced bullet holes and exploding vehicles. This is why the Marines came and why they are still here.

"I think all of the Marines look at the progress that is being made and feel like they're an important part of the future of Iraq," Jarrard said. "Peace and security equals prosperity for these people, and in an extended way the prosperity of Iraq equals security for America. The parents of these Marines should be proud of these Marines and the job they're doing."

convincing me further.
 "This job is really enjoyable," said Firefighter James Hull. "It's great to have to work hard and get to know your people. Getting to know the crews is probably the best part of the job. You really get close."
 Not one of the firefighters I've met so far has had anything negative to say about their job and the lifestyle that comes with it.
 "I've been doing this for eight years and I've been with Center Fire for five," said Swift. "It's almost sad to collect a paycheck for this. I don't see it as a job; I see it as a privilege."
 "It's all based on camaraderie," he added. "It's feels like an extension of your personal family. When you think about it, you end up spending half your life with the guys on your crew."
 As we sat in the lounge talking, an emergency medical services call came through to the dispatch. Within two minutes of the call, the crews of Truck and Medic Ambulance 451 were departing the firehouse for Felix Field.
 Three minutes after the response, the two vehicles arrived at Felix Field. Immediately, the two emergency medical technicians from the ambulance rushed over to the injured person. After treating the patient on-scene for a non-life threatening injury, they loaded him into the ambulance and transported him to the Robert E.

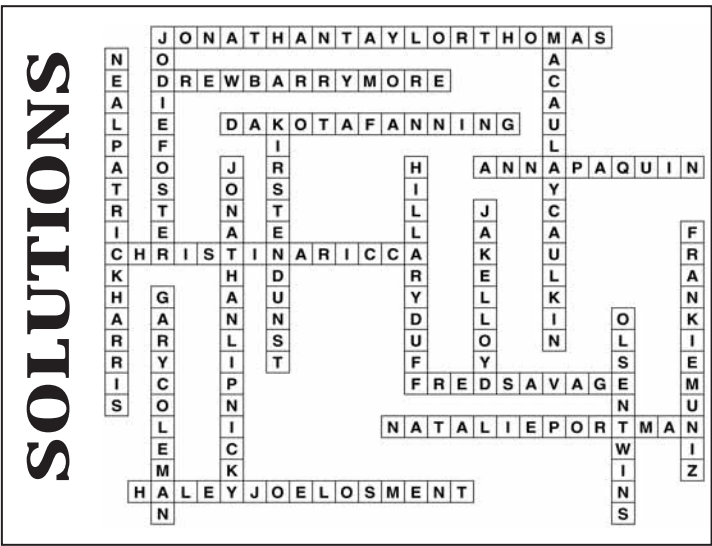
Bush Naval Hospital.
 Once the patient arrived at the emergency room, the responders took care of the necessary paperwork and also took the time to restock the ambulance with medical supplies. Then, they went back to the firehouse. I always knew firefighters could get to a call quickly, but the speed, knowledge and professionalism they displayed that night were astounding.
 Once we were back at the firehouse, a few of us sat down and talked more about the job. By now, they know I'm taking a lot of interest in the job and are more than happy to answer my questions. After a few hours of that, we all went to get some rest.
 At 6:30 a.m., everyone wakes up to prepare for the oncoming shift. The firefighters take time for personal hygiene. Then, the crew cleans up the house and the vehicles. The oncoming crew starts to trickle in around 7:30 a.m. Some of the guys I already knew ask me how my ride-along went.
 Although relatively slow, the shift I was on board for was a great experience. I had the rare opportunity to set foot in Center Fire's shoes. Through the experience, I picked up on a lot about the day-to-day life of a firefighter and even learned a thing or two about the job itself by talking to the people who do it every day. Even though I'm not a firefighter, I feel as though a lot of them consider me to be "one of the guys."

Operation Hero graduates children into Kids Care Club

Children participating in the Operation Hero program graduated from the 10-week course Wednesday at Condor Elementary School.

The children can enroll in Kids Care Club, after completing the Operation Hero program.

"They have to complete Operation Hero to get into Kids Care Club," said Anita Neu-Fultz, executive director of the Armed Services YMCA.

The course is designed for children in second through sixth grade who have difficulty adjusting to school. The program is available at every ASYMCA across the nation for all military children.

The difficulty is normally connected to the arrival of a new duty station, recent deployments of their parents, and the highly demanding military lifestyle.

The program started with Me Myself and I, a beginning class designed to bring the instructors and children together on a trusting, friendship level.

"At first they were shy to speak to us," said Rita Mayes, Operation Hero program coordinator. "Then we saw a big difference in each child, they start-

ed asking questions about everything."

After Me Myself and I, the children were taught about family, friends, responsibility, emotions and bullying during Circle Time.

Circle Time gives the children a chance to participate in discussions and role-playing activities dealing with character development, non-violent ways to deal with bullies, anger control, conflict resolution, goal setting, being a good friend, respecting others, making right choices, good habits and developing strengths and understanding weaknesses.

The children are also able to let loose, especially during Nickelodeon Night, when children were drenched with chocolate syrup and whipped cream.

Neu-Fultz explained that although Nickelodeon Night is extremely messy it is important for the children to have fun, especially when parents are deployed. Operation Hero also helps children share their feelings about their parents deploying, and their constant moving around the world.

"They had a lot of big questions about why they have to move a lot," said Mayes. "We explained to them moving is part of being a military child and they have the opportunity to get out and explore the world. When they

The first hour of Operation Hero is spent doing homework and independent reading.

"They look forward to coming to the classes," explained Neu-Fultz. "Children were asking to do their homework."

The children also participated in art projects and games that focused on specific academic skills such as spelling and math.

"I think it was so fun," said Charlie Mitteff, a 10-year-old Operation Hero graduate. "I wish it would last forever. I wish it was

never ending."

Mitteff, along with many other children who graduated from Operation Hero will continue on to Kids Care Club.

"I would like to go to Kids Care Club," said Mitteff. "It is more about kids and the community."

FMEAP helps military members, spouses get jobs

The Military Family Act of 1985 helped establish the Family Member Employment Assistance Program to assist military spouses and family members over the age of 16 with employment issues.

FMEAP teaches family members resume writing, job interview techniques and preparation for an interview, federal application information and federal employment opportunities.

“I understand the difficulty job seekers could potentially face,” said Joanne Ferraro, employment development section, Marine Corps Community Services Career Resource Office. “What we try to do is encourage job seekers to think outside the box and creatively.”

Advantages family members receive from using FMEAP are learning about current labor market, average salary and wage trends in local areas.

Job seekers are given tips on what to wear to an interview, and questions they

should ask during an interview.

Volunteering at the career resource office can also assist family members gain skills in an office setting such as answering phones, helping with paper work and using a computer, which can later be put on their resume.

“People who don’t have a lot of job skills or want to hone their job skills or they are not finding a job can volunteer with us,” said Ferraro. “They get a wonderful experience.”

FMEAP also offers a program called Microsoft Office Specialist Certification Program, which provides individuals with the training they need to be certified in one or more of Microsoft Office® desktop applications.

According to a MOS Certification Program pamphlet, individuals who earn the certificate are acknowledged in the skills to work with Microsoft Office® programs.

MOS certified individuals report an increase in proficiency and productivity with employers, co-workers and clients.

Becoming MOS certified can also be put in a resume to assist job seekers.

“We encourage our clients and spouses to take advantage of the MOS program,” said Ferraro. “Your job market and earning ability goes up dramatically.”

CRO representatives help individuals prepare for interviews by holding a mock interview, where they will give family members tips on how to conduct an efficient interview and build confidence.

“We work one-on-one with them because everyone is different,” said Ferraro. “Everyone has different experiences, education, and wants and desires, working one-on-one will help us help them achieve that.”

Virginia Sulick, Career Resource Manager, said FMEAP representatives still hear from some clients that had received assistance from FMEAP that have moved on to other military installations.

“It is an awesome program,” said Sulick.

CRO representatives love to see the families reap the benefits and awards from the hard work of those involved.

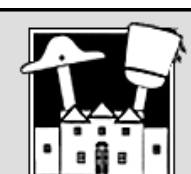
