War Dogs topple Exercise Watchtower

Across part of the Combat Center's mountainous terrain, two forces went head-to-head during Exercise Watchtower. They fought through long days and cold nights while competing for control of the Prospect Corridor training area.

Throughout the exercise, Companies E and G, part of 2nd Battalion, 7th Marine Regiment, were tasked to move through and secure the ranges while Company F acted as opposing forces with the objective to delay the arrival of their opposing force to their final objective at the Prospect Corridor until 5 a.m., Nov. 11.

"There are approximately 130 Marines and sailors in Fox Company," said 2nd Lt. Joshua Foster, platoon commander, F Co., 2/7. "Our job is to act as the opposing forces for the exercise so the rest of the battalion can work against real opponents."

F Co. used hills and rock formations in the terrain to keep themselves hidden from sniper teams that acted as intelligence scouts and over watch for the rest of the battalion. The majority of the company's attacks were conducted during nighttime hours to further

Engineers take-on ship building

everything from small structures to roads and bridges. Now they're building ships.

Marines of Company A, 7th Engineers Support Battalion, 1st Force Service Support Group, recently completed production of five scale model ships and a 139 square foot game board for the 7th Marine Amphibious Brigade.

Scaled down 108 times, the ships and game board served as a tabletop version of the Maritime Prepositioning Ships Program. Officers of the 7thj MAB viewed and operated the playing pieces as they learned proper positioning of the cargo ships during loading and off-loading phases of the program. The game board, set on a plateau 20 minutes from mainside, was constructed of plywood, plastic and tarp and was color coded to depict elements of an urban and harbor setting, such as cargo staging areas, air and ground combat areas and fuel and water supply areas. It took approximately 10 days to build while the ships, each seven-feet long, took, took two and a half months.

"These Marines deserve a lot of credit for the work

Marine engineers have been tasked with building they did," said Sergeant Dwayne Scott, non-commissioned officer in charge of the ship building force. "They spent a lot of time a lot of time making sure

> every aspect of the models was correct." Close examination of the ships reveals meticulous attention to detail. Made mostly of wood, the models possess masts made of toothpicks, smokestacks carved from Styrofoam cups, and landing pads where toy-like helicopters touch and go.

> "As the nucleus of the Bridge Service Support Group-7, we were tasked with this project," said Captain Steve F. Barilich, company commander. "We have the tools and the expertise to do such a job.

> "We're also giving the staff of the7th MAB an idea of current MPS operation. By using the game board and models provided, they can learn and adjust to the program," Barilich added.

> As for the engineers, they are now working hard on other projects more familiar to their normal duties. Yet the ships, now drydocked in the engineers' workshop, are ready to weigh anchor when needed.

WHAT I'VE LEARNED

Alfredo Queens, NY. Legal assistance staff non-commissioned officer in charge, 31 NEWBALL

>It has always been viewed upon that if you were not an athlete, a musician, or from a rich family in my neighborhood then you could not amount to success. Many people choose to stay there because of their heritage or they believe that there is no way out.

>Follow current events, always; you have to know what is happening in the world. You can't just be blind to what is going on because certain things can affect you even if you're not aware of them. You won't be able to always handle everything at that moment in time but you need to be up to date.

>Everyone has someone that inspires them; everyone usually says their mother, father or children. I'd say the next generation inspires me; it's going to be hard to be there for them and leave a legacy behind to express my inspiration with a generation I don't even have familiarization with. It's important because they influence me and my actions and I influence theirs.

>My uncle also inspires me because he learned how to live and breathe all 24 hours of a day. He lived every day to the fullest. That was an acquired gift to his children and to our family. He served in the Army during WWII.

>My English teacher taught me the importance of walking your own path. Your path is your own accomplishment; no one forced you to do it, it's something you believe in. It became his own passion to become an English professor and he did it; no one stopped him, instead he grew from those around him.

>Education is always continuous. The youngest and the oldest, we can all learn from someone.

>Writing has always been a hobby of mine. It was something

"The Battalion Assault Course is a test for the battalion, showing that they are able to conduct continuous operations and follow-on missions," said Cpl. Jason Trent, a squad leader with Golf Company, 2nd Battalion, 2nd Marine Regiment. "My squad's responsibility was to hold the mountainside during the defense. There was an area about three-hundred meters away off to our right-hand side that the enemy was able to come through. As soon as they came into the open we were able to engage with our weapons systems." the air, ground and logistics combat elements, utilizing the full abilities of the Marine Air-Ground Task Force to complete the training objectives.

"I think my squad as a whole did really well," said Trent. "We got the rocket shots off successfully and both hit their targets. We had good communication, ammo was getting passed around, and [ammunition, casualty, equipment] reports were flowing. I think we were on point."

The battalion conducted a wide variety of exercises throughout ITX to prepare for their upcoming deployment to Southeast Asia as part of the Unit Deployment Program.

"I love it out here," said Trent. "You get to do more here than you could ever do at Camp Lejeune. We have a broader scope of things that we can do out here. To be able to come out here and in my opinion train at a higher level and do more complex attacks and complex missions, it doesn't just keep us ready, it boost our readiness."



FRESH GREEN BEAN CASSEROLE

When it comes to Thanksgiving, the turkey is the center of attention, but every hero needs a sidekick. This fresh green bean casserole supplements any Thanksgiving menu excellently and can be prepared in as little as an hour. -Lance Cpl. Levi Schultz

Prep: 20 minutes Cook: 40 minutes Total Time: 60 minutes Yields 6 servings

INGREDIENTS

- Nonstick cooking spray, for greasing
- 5 cups sliced green beans
- 4 1/4 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- 1 cup panko breadcrumbs
- 1 cup grated Parmesan 1 tablespoon plus 2 teaspoons canola oil
- 1 1/2 cups diced onions
- 2 cups sliced baby bella mushrooms 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1/2 cup reduced-fat sour cream
- 1/2 teaspoon House Seasoning, recipe follows
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- HOUSE SEASONING:
- 1 cup kosher salt
- 1/4 cup garlic powder
- 1/4 cup black pepper


DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Spray a 1 1/2-quart baking dish with nonstick spray.

Boil the green beans in the chicken broth for about 20 minutes, and then drain, reserving $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups of the chicken broth. Meanwhile, mix together the breadcrumbs, Parmesan and 2

teaspoons of the oil in a small bowl. Set aside. Heat the remaining 1 tablespoon oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Sauté the onions until translucent, 2 to 3 minutes. and then add the mushrooms and continue to cook for 3 to 4 minutes longer. Remove from the heat.

Pour the reserved 1 1/2 cups chicken broth back into the oot the green beans boiled in and bring to a boil. Add the green beans to the skillet with the mushrooms and onions. While that is coming to a boil, combine the cornstarch and 1/4 cup water in a small bowl to make a slurry. Slowly pour the slurry into the boiling broth, whisking constantly as it thickens, about 2 minutes. Pour the thickened mixture over the green beans and add the sour cream, House Seasoning and salt. Stir well.

APPLE PIE

Nothing tops off Thanksgiving like a fresh, homemade apple pie. It takes a little preparation, but you can prepare an unbaked pie and freeze it, making for an easy fresh-baked desert on Thanksgiving. It's delicious and it's one of the healthier deserts out there. -Lance Cpl. Connor Hancock

INGREDIENTS

- Dough:
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 4 teaspoons sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon fine salt
- 14 tablespoons cold butter, diced
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten with 2 tablespoons cold water
- Filling:
- 2 tablespoons freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 3 pounds baking apples like Golden Delicious, Cortland, or Mutsu
- 2/3 cup sugar, plus more for sprinkling on the pie
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- Generous pinch of ground nutmeg
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten

DIRECTIONS

Make the dough by hand. In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, sugar, and salt. Using your fingers, work the butter into the dry ingredients until it resembles yellow corn meal mixed with bean sized bits of butter. (If the flour/butter mixture gets warm, refrigerate it for 10 minutes before proceeding.) Add the egg and stir the dough together with a fork or by hand in the bowl. If the dough is dry, sprinkle up to a tablespoon more of cold water over the mixture.

Make the dough in a food processor. With the

This Orange-Bourbon recipe was fantastic when my friends and I made this a few years back for Thanksgivings. The Orange and the bourbon complement each other perfectly resulting in a sweet and tasty turkey. -Cpl. Julio McGraw

Total Time: 27 hour 30 minutes Prep: 24 hour Cook: 3 hour 30 minutes

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (12-pound) fresh or frozen whole turkey, thawed 2 cups fresh orange juice (about 6 oranges) 1 3/4 cup bourbon (More if desired), divided 1/3 cup molasses
- 3/4 teaspoon salt, divided
- 4 oranges, peeled
- Cooking spray
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- Orange slices (optional)
- Flat-leaf parsley sprigs (optional)

DIRECTIONS

Remove giblets and neck from turkey; discard. Rinse turkey thoroughly with cold water; pat dry. Combine orange juice, 1 1/4 cup bourbon, and molasses in a 2-gallon heavy-duty ziptop plastic bag; add turkey. Seal and marinate in refrigerator 4 to 24 hours turning bag occasionally. Remove turkey from bag, reserving marinade.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Tie ends of legs with cord. Lift wing tip up and over back and tuck under bird. Sprinkle 1/2 teaspoon salt into body cavity. Stuff cavity with oranges. Place turkey on a broiler pan coated with cooking spray or on a rack set in a shallow pan. Insert meat thermometer into meaty part of thigh, making sure not to touch bone. Bake at 350 degrees for 3 hours or until thermometer registers 180 degrees. (Cover loosely with foil if it gets too brown.) Remove turkey from oven. Cover loosely with foil; let stand at least 10 minutes before carving. Discard oranges.

Pour reserved marinade into saucepan; bring to a boil. Skim foam from mixture with a slotted spoon; discard. Reduce heat to medium; cook until reduced to 3 1/2 cups (about 15 minutes).

Pour into the baking dish and sprinkle with the panko and cheese mixture. Bake until the casserole is hot, about 10 minutes, and then broil until the breadcrumb topping is slightly browned, 1 to 2 minutes.

Mix together the salt, garlic powder and pepper.



BAKED ASPARAGUS AND ZUCCHINI BUNDLES

Looking for a way to incorporate healthy asparagus and zucchini into your Thanksgivings meal? This recipe from my mother's cookbook for baked asparagus and zucchini bundles is certain to make this healthy addition taste great. -Cpl. Julio McGraw

Counter top: 20 minutes Oven: 40 minutes Total time: 60 minutes

INGREDIENTS

1 Bundle of Asparagus 1 Green zucchini 1 Yellow zucchini Salt to taste Pepper to taste Lemon spice 2 Tbs. butter 1/4 cup of water

DIRECTIONS

To begin this dish, preheat oven to 350 degrees. Clean and cut both zucchinis into 1/4 inch thick rings. Cut out the center of the zucchini with enough room to fit 3 to 4 asparagus spears inside but do not throw out center. Alternate the color rings to hold 3 to 4 asparagus spears together as a bundle. Arrange the insides of the zucchini on the bottom of the baking dish with the asparagus and zucchini bundles on top. Add butter, water, salt and seasoning then bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes.

machine fitted with the metal blade, pulse the flour, sugar, and salt until combined. Add the butter and pulse until it resembles yellow corn meal mixed with bean size bits of butter, about 10 times. Add the egg and pulse 1 to 2 times; don't let the dough form into a ball in the machine. (If the dough is very dry add up to a tablespoon more of cold water.) Remove the bowl from the machine, remove the blade, and bring the dough together by hand.

Form the dough into a disk, wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate until thoroughly chilled, at least 1 hour.

Make the filling. Put the lemon juice in a medium bowl. Peel, halve, and core the apples. Cut each half into 4 wedges. Toss the apple with the lemon juice. Add the sugar and toss to combine evenly.

In a large skillet, melt the butter over medium-high heat. Add the apples, and cook, stirring, until the sugar dissolves and the mixture begins to simmer, about 2 minutes. Cover, reduce heat to medium-low, and cook until the apples soften and release most of their juices, about 7 minutes.

Strain the apples in a colander over a medium bowl to catch all the juice. Shake the colander to get as much liquid as possible. Return the juices to the skillet, and simmer over medium heat until thickened and lightly caramelized, about 10 minutes.

In a medium bowl, toss the apples with the reduced juice and spices. Set aside to cool completely. (This filling can be made up to 2 days ahead and refrigerated or frozen for up to 6 months.)

Cut the dough in half. On a lightly floured surface, roll each half of dough into a disc about 11 to 12 inches wide. Layer the dough between pieces of parchment or wax paper on a baking sheet, and refrigerate for at least 10 minutes.

Place a rack in the lower third of the oven and preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.

Line the bottom of a 9-inch pie pan with one of the discs of dough, and trim it so it lays about 1/2 inch beyond the edge of the pan. Put the apple filling in the pan and mound it slightly in the center. Brush the top edges of the dough with the egg. Place the second disc of dough over the top. Fold the top layer of dough under the edge of the bottom layer and press the edges together to form a seal. Flute the edge as desired. Brush the surface of the dough with egg and then sprinkle with sugar. Pierce the top of the dough in several places to allow steam to escape while baking. Refrigerate for at least 15 minutes.

Bake the pie on a baking sheet until the crust is golden, about 50 minutes. Cool on a rack before serving. The pie keeps well at room temperature (covered) for 24 hours, or refrigerated for up to 4 days.

Cook's Note: You may freeze the uncooked pie, but don't brush it with egg or dust it with sugar beforehand. Place the pie in the freezer for 30 minutes, to harden it slightly, and then double wrap it with plastic wrap. Freeze for up to 6 months. When ready to bake, unwrap the pie and brush it with egg and sprinkle with sugar. Bake, from the frozen state, until golden brown, about 1 hour and 10 minutes.

Combine 1/2 cup bourbon and flour in a small bowl, stirring well with a whisk. Add to reduced marinade; bring to a boil and cook 1 minute, stirring constantly. Stir in 1/4 teaspoon salt. Serve sauce with turkey.





CARROT SOUP WITH SCALLIONS AND POPPY SEEDS

Seasonal soups are a great idea for Thanksgiving because you can make it well in advance, make lots of it, and simply heat and garnish when ready to serve. This particular soup is festive, healthy and relatively easy to make. -Lauren Kurkimilis

Total time: 60 minutes Serves: 12

INGREDIENTS

2 tbsp. unsalted butter 3 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil 1 large onion 1 qt. low-sodium vegetable broth 1 qt. water 2 lb. carrots 6 large scallions 2 tsp. poppy seeds $\frac{1}{2}$ c. heavy cream $\frac{1}{2}$ c. milk Salt and freshly ground pepper DIRECTIONS

In a large pot, melt the butter in 1 tablespoon of the olive oil. Add the onion, cover, and cook over low heat, stirring occasionally, until softened, about 5 minutes. Add the broth and water along with the carrots and bring to a boil over high heat. Cover and simmer over low heat until the carrots are tender, about 30 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, heat the remaining 2 tablespoons of olive oil. Add the scallions and poppy seeds and cook over moderately high heat, stirring, until the scallions are softened, about 1 minute.

Working in batches, puree the carrot soup in a blender until smooth; transfer to a clean saucepan. Stir in the cream and milk and simmer over moderate heat, stirring. Season the soup with salt and pepper and ladle into bowls. Garnish with the scallions and poppy seeds and serve.

Down & Dirty

Sandra Bullock, Billy Bob Thornton make politics personal in 'Crisis'

"Our Brand is Crisis" Starring Sandra Bullock & Billy Bob Thornton Directed by David Gordon Green Rated R

"I can convince myself of many things, if the price is right," says Sandra Bullock's character, "Calamity Jane" Bodine, in Our Brand is Crisis.

Jane is pretty good at convincing other people, too. That's why the formerly formidable campaign strategist is lured out of early retirement to help an unpopular Bolivian president in an upcoming election—by convincing the reluctant public, through whatever means necessary, that they should vote for him.

But this battle's not just political, it's also personal: Bodine has to match wits with an old nemesis, Pat Candy (Billy Bob Thornton), who's been hired to strategize for the other side.

It's based on things that went down at a real 2002 Bolivian election, which was chronicled in an award-winning 2005 documentary of the same name. Thornton's character is a movie remold of former hardball strategist James Carville, who appeared as himself in the original film. Bullock's character—a part originally written for a male—is an amalgam of several other actual people.

Bullock and Thornton provide the movie's real spark;

Scoot McNairy, Ann Dowd and Anthony Mackie are also aboard as Calamity Jane's team members. Zoe Kazan plays a young dirty-tricks research wonk brought in to turn up the heat when things shift into true "crisis" overdrive.

George Clooney is one of the producers. The director, David Gordon Green, has a wide-ranging resume that includes the stoner comedies Pineapple Express and Your Highness. Peter Straughan, who provided the screenplay, is also the writer of the espionage thriller Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy. The movie has some solid DNA, but it never seems to know whether it wants to make us think, make us chuckle or make us sad. Is it political parody with heart, a satire that jabs with its funny bone, or a south-of-the-border rom-com based on real headlines? (The biggest audience response, for what it's worth, comes from Bullock's bare buttocks hanging out an open bus window.)

If you're a political junkie, this is your time of year. The presidential candidate debates make for riveting, sometimes-outrageous TV, and shows like The Good Wife, Scandal, Veep and the new Agent X take viewers inside the heated (fictionalized) heavings of Washington, D.C. Our Brand is Crisis brings up some timely points about what it takes to mount—and win—a campaign.

But is anyone surprised that politics plays dirty? That strategists can be snake-oil salesmen who convince

Yet even Wellington realized that his methods left something to be desired. In his old age someone asked him what, if anything, he would do differently if he had his life to live over again. Wellington thought a moment then replied, "I'd give more praise."

Think about it, dear friends, and do not hesitate to offer praise and gratitude at every opportunity. My mother often said that we are never wrong when we offer our thanks and our praise.

This Thanksgiving give more praise to the Creator for the beauty of the earth and the glory of the skies. Give more praise to your husband or your wife. Give more praise to your children. Give more praise to your friends. Give more praise to those who serve your needs in restaurants, grocery stores and in other public places. Give more praise!

The spirit of what I have written brings to mind the insightful words of William Butler Yeats:




