Heavy equipment operators and maintainers with Marine Wing Support Squadron 374 and MWSS-371 conducted new equipment training with the John Deere 250 GR Hydraulic Excavator near the Strategic Expeditionary Landing Field, Jan. 11-22.

MWSS-374 held the new equipment training over a two-week period for heavy equipment maintainers and operators to conduct hands-on style training with the new excavator taught by the U.S. Army Tank and Automotive Command-Life Cycle Management Command.

This is the first time MWSS-374 is using this model of hydraulic excavator aboard the Combat Center, and the excavator enables Marines to fulfill critical engineering missions including: Backhoe excavations, development of field fortifications, digging water and sewer lines, emplacement of culverts in-road, airfield construction and creating command bunkers. It completes these missions by utilizing interchangeable attachments. The excavator is scheduled to be fielded across the Marine Corps by September 2016.

# Marine Scout Dogs aid in Vietnam War

Wounded in the foot an cut off from the rest dog to return. of the reconnaissance patrol during a fire-fight, Woton crawled underneath the flying bullets to join the their members of the team.

He had been scouting several meters to the front when he signaled to Pfc. Nicholas J. Willis that the enemy was ahead.

Willis, a scout in the 1st Military Police Bn, 1st Marine Division, alerted the rest of the patrol and commanded Woton, a Marine scout

Before he could respond, heavy fire broke out. Woton was wounded and in the firefight that followed there was no way for the Marines to

"It seemed like hours," Willis said "before he came crawling on his belly through the fire to our position. We called in a 'Med-Evac' but it was unable to land."

By the time Woton was lifted out of the area

that night he had lost a lot of blood and was suffering from shock.

At the hospital Army Cpt. Wayne E. Cunningham worked for three hours to extract the bullet from Woton's leg. During the operation Woton stopped breathing six times but was revived by swift action of the doctor.

Cunningham estimates Woton will be out of action for a month but will recover. For handler Willis and the Marines it can't be too soon.





# Donald Miami, Fla. Lt. Cmdr., Headquarters Battalion Chaplain, 37 BAKER

Baker began his military career as a Marine officer. Over the years, he developed a love for music as well as a desire to help the Marines with whom he served and made the decision to become a chaplain.

>Both my parents were enlisted in the military and I was born on a military base. The idea of joining the military didn't happen until later in my life and as I approached adulthood I couldn't believe I never considered the possibility. I first became active duty Dec. 15, 2000.

>My decision to become a chaplain came to a head while I was serving as the commander for Company A, Headquarters Battalion [aboard the Combat Center]. I saw a lot of Marines making messes of their lives with different decisions and tragedies, over time I developed [sympathy] for the Marines. What I wanted to do was tell the people, who I love the most, about what I love the most, which is God.

>Having been raised on a military **base**, I understood what the dependent perspective is like because I was that military child. Being on active duty, allowed me to understand what service members go through because I was there too.

> believe I'm doing what I was put on this Earth to do. Having all my experience and having walked the same path as the Marines there is a very easy connection with them.

>People that have been influential to me would be my father-in-law, who was the chaplain at my first unit, and my father because of his work ethic. He showed me if you put your mind to whatever it is you want to do, you can do it.

>If I could have the perfect day, I would go snowboarding, spearfishing and surfing and I would travel between each of those locations on my Harley.

>I first started playing guitar because I wanted to learn Jimmy Buffett to get the girls. Just through learning those songs I actually became pretty good at the guitar.

>My first time leading worship was actually at this chapel where I lead the music program. I kept learning overtime and increasingly got better as I developed a passion for it.

>My favorite era of secular music would have to be '90s alternative. I love praise and worship music in general but specifically Hillsong music is my favorite. >Music is a gift that everyone shares.

When you think about it everyone can enjoy music, it is what distinguishes conversation from something that has melody, tone and intonation.

>It's the same thing with food. Food can taste like paper but can also allow us to have a whole gamut of flavors.

>Music really is an expression ofheart and soul. It's interesting how influential music is. There's a famous philosopher who said, "I don't care who writes the laws of the country, I want to know who writes

units and installations.

"We in the Department of the Navy have come a long way in the past six or seven years," McGinn said. "Whether it's new energy technology like solar panels or new procedures, we're finding out how much progress we're capable of making."

The Marines of ESD earned the award for their ability to record information with regard to energy usage in an expeditionary environment.

"ESD's role is to allow the equipment in the enhanced exercise allowance pool to be utilized for data capture," Pape said. "The Combat Center is the only place in the Marine Corps, in a training environment, where we can get accurate data on the amount of energy that our ground equipment is using during operations."

Divisions such as ESD, Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs, and Public Works Department are responsible in part for the installation's success in their conservation efforts. Due to the programs put in place by the installation and executed by each division, the base has not only met but exceeded expectations with regard to protecting the Combat Center's natural resources.


"ESD is a tenant aboard this installation," Pape said. "It's important to ensure that we participate in all the Combat Center energy programs and ensuring that we are being good stewards with government resources, not only to save money, but to protect the environment."



# Predator and prey: Pre-Scout Sniper students stalk targets

JACKSONVILLE, N.C. - The 2nd Marine Division Combat Skills Center held its final week of instruction for aspiring Marine scout snipers as part of the Pre-Scout Sniper Course at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, Jan. 22.

The course concluded its three-week training period by bringing Marines to the Greater Sandy Run training area. Following day and night land navigation, Marines were required to "stalk," or pursue a target while remaining undetected.

"The Marines are using all the knowledge they have gained to execute a stalk," said Sgt. Bradley S. Brouwer, the chief instructor of the course. "The intent is to have them move, identify and shoot without being detected."

Marines traversed between 800 and 1,000 meters as stealthily as possible, relying on the camouflage of their ghillie suits, their grassy environment and careful movement to keep as low of a profile as possible. Instructors observed the area through scout sniper observation telescopes, keeping an eye open for error that would give a Marine's position away to the enemy.

"There is no room for error in a scout sniper platoon," said Cpl. Aaron Straight, a student in the course. "Something as simple as leaving behind a piece of tape is a matter of life or death. It can be challenging to stay mentally engaged and avoid a serious slip-up."


Brouwer hopes the skills developed over the past three weeks will help Marines be successful in the school house.

"We stood this course up to give these Marines a buffer-course before they tackle the real thing, and we want to see a higher graduation rate at the school house and the production of skilled scout snipers," Brouwer said.

Straight considers his completion of the course a confidence-booster for the challenges he will face in one of the Corps' most elite schools.

"We did so much shooting and land navigation that a helped me improve all around," Straight said. "The instructors here are some of the most knowledgeable scout snipers in the Marine Corps and it was great to work under them."

Marines are scheduled to begin the Basic Scout





# Butting Heads

### Will Smith tackles the NFL in 'Concussion'

"Concussion" Starring Will Smith, Alec Baldwin & Albert Brooks Directed by Peter Landesman Rated PG-13

Will Smith has fought zombies, space aliens and killer robots. Now he's squaring off against an even bigger, completely human foe-and certainly a much more popular one.

In Concussion, he plays Dr. Bennett Omalu, who discovers the link between football and CTE, chronic traumatic encephalopathy—potentially fatal brain damage from repeated concussions.

The true story (originally told in a 2009 article in GQ magazine) begins as we meet Nigerian-born Omalu in 2002, while he's working in Pittsburgh as the county coroner's forensic pathologist. The untimely death, and bizarre final days, of a former Pittsburgh Steeler football Hall of Famer, Mike Webster (David Morse), troubles him: Webster's autopsy reveals severe brain trauma that caused him to go crazy, freak out and eventually expire of a heart attack. When Omalu learns of other NFL players dying in similar fashion, he investigates further and comes to a conclusion that almost no one wants to hear—especially not the National Football League.

Playing football can kill you.

Unlike some other creatures, such as the woodpecker or the bighorn sheep, Omalu points out, humans have no natural shock absorber in our skulls to cushion the blow when one of our noggins impact with something hard—like another noggin. Nature, or providence, simply did not

equip us that way. Therefore, Omalu reasons, "God did not intend for us to play football."

Smith, a bona fide movie star, is outstanding in a non-flashy role that doesn't involve car chases, spaceships, shootouts or CGI special effects—just straight-up, strong, dig-in acting and a very plausible, start-to-finish nail-down of Dr. O's West African accent and mannerisms. He makes you feel Omalu's passionate sense of commitment—and his dream to be accepted as "American"—as the NFL tries to quash his research and discredit him.

Albert Brooks is Cyril Wecht, the county coroner who helps Omalu while warning him of squaring off against with the NFL. "You're going to war with a corporation that owns a day of the week," he tells him. Alec Baldwin plays Dr. Julian Bailes, the former Steelers team doctor who assists Omalu in getting his message to football players, managers, agents and the commissioner. "You've turned on the lights and given their biggest boogeyman a name," Bailes says.

British actress Gugu Mbatha-Raw plays Prema, the Nigerian student who becomes Omalu's wife, reminding him that his family name means "He who knows, speaks."

But the movie belongs to Smith, who tackles what might be his one of his trickiest, juiciest roles—a crusading underdog with a potentially life-saving message that falls on mostly deaf ears. "Tell the truth—tell the truth!" a frustrated Omalu jabs at a NFL team neurosurgeon who refuses to admit there's any connection between football and brain injury.

As millions of football fans tune into games this weekend, it's a truth that will likely be drowned out by the symphony of cheers in stadiums all across America.



# **Permanent Change of Station travel:** MARADMIN 001/16 now in effect

CAMP LEJEUNE, N.C. - The busiest season for duty station changes is fast approaching and a new policy was recently released in an effort to make travel procedures smoother for Marines. According to Marine administrative message 001/16, beginning Jan. 1, Marines undergoing a permanent change of station must use their government travel charge card for all expenses related to the move.

This policy replaces travel advances and protects Marines from being charged interest or overdraft fees on their personal accounts.

"The main reason why we are doing this is because it makes moves more efficient and more cost effective," said Chief Warrant Officer 2 Laura Brossman, the orders section officer in charge. "Most of the rest of the Department of Defense has already transitioned to it and they have been using it for a while."

The process begins when a Marine receives PCS orders. The Marine will log onto Marine Online and complete an outbound interview. Once the Marine has confirmed that they are in possession of a GTCC, the card will be activated 10 days prior to the date the Marine is scheduled to detach from their current unit. The card will deactivate 15 days after the approved report date. The Marine will then submit a travel voucher upon checking in to the new unit.

Marines undergoing a permanent change of address will also complete an outbound interview on MOL but will not use the GTCC for the transition.

"The biggest difference is that everything is automated now," said Capt. Leslie Harkness, the agency program coordinator in charge of oversight for all the GTCC within the division. "Before, Marines would have to go print out their web orders, go to the [Installation Personnel Administration Center]... they would have to do all this stuff via paper and it would take a lot of extra

time... to do the paperwork, and to have the advance sent to you... this makes the process much more seamless and smooth."

Some of the other benefits of the change that Harkness highlighted include the fact that Marines would not be charged interest on their personal accounts, they would have customer support from Citi Bank and their unit APC's during the PCS transition. Using the card would not affect the Marines' credit history. The money would be immediately available negating the need to wait for a travel advance. Also, the Marine would be in a mission-critical status during the move, meaning that they will not receive any bills or overdue notices until they check into their

"It will make it easier for the Marine to not have to pay out of pocket for things in their PCS travel," said Harkness. "It's going to help the younger Marines especially."

Brossman emphasized the importance of keeping all purchase receipts and keeping track of statements through the Citi Bank website.

The credit limit on the GTCC will be set based on the estimated cost of that Marine's travel entitlements. Some of the expenses that are authorized to be charged to the card include authorized transportation expenses, lodging, meals and expenses previously paid with a dislocation allowance such as carpet cleaning or utility deposits. The card is not authorized for personal purchases such as uniform items or auto repairs.

Use of the GTCC for personally procured moves, formally known as do-it-yourself moves, or permanent change of assignment moves is not authorized in connection with this policy.

CWO4 Russell Johnson, a food service officer who recently underwent a PCA from 2nd Marine Logistics Group to 2nd Headquarters Battalion, thought that the use of the GTCC will be a great tool to teach younger Marines to

be financially accountable and was surprised how easy the online module was.

"The new outbound interview process is light-years easier than the old data sheets," said Johnson. "It will save Marines time from having to run back and forth to IPAC so many times."

The Marine Corps has been transitioning to the outbound interview module for a couple of years. IPAC Camp Lejeune and the surrounding PACs are some of the last PACs in the Marine Corps to undergo the

"Hopefully with the units and the IPAC working together, we can make it as smooth as possible," said Brossman.

"We are looking at March first for the targeted date for all units to receive training and to transition."

Harkness encouraged Marines to contact their administration shop to receive guidance or to answer any questions. From there, Marines can contact their IPAC or unit APC for more assistance. For more detailed information about the step-by-step process, Marines can watch a YouTube video explaining the MARADMIN by visiting https://youtu. be/V7WMkMVX8GQ.

"Any unit is more than welcome to contact the IPAC for training on outbound procedures as well as any of the areas we support," said Brossman.

# Ten years later extreme race is world class



The boulder laden rock-climbing sections force riders and drivers to showcase their technical operating skills and the extreme ability of their equipment.

Race founder Dave Cole said the growth of the race over the past ten years has been amazing to watch.

"Ten years ago we wanted to do something different and a race like this had never been run before," Cole said. "What started out as a single race has turned into a week full of events and qualifiers that people come to see from all over the world."

Cole said the races garner the majority of the attention but the qualifying rounds are a great time to watch racers push their vehicles.

"The course is more accessible on qualifying days and drivers are really pushing themselves to try and put in a good time. Qualifying rounds will be held Tuesday and Wednesday."

King of the Motos is a true extreme test for 2-wheel riders who are forced to take their bikes up sections of boulders that seem impassable at first glance.

Somewhere between 80 and 120 riders will line up for their chance to attack the course early Sunday morning.

The Vision X ULTRA4 vs. SRRS East/ West Shootout is always a fan favorite and will be held at the Chocolate Thunder rock climb this year.

The event pits the Southern Rock Racing Series rock bouncers against ULTRA4 cars and local racers for nationwide bragging

The event has been held at Back Door in previous years, but is being moved to Chocolate Thunder in 2016 because of the accessibility for the number of viewers who have been packed in at Back Door.

The night event is known for its rabid fans and incredible action on a single rock-climbing section.

The event will culminate when the big boys take on the extreme track during the 2016 Nitto King of the Hammers at 8 a.m. Feb. 5.

Mike Bedwell, out of Big Bear Lake, had trouble keeping all four wheels on the ground at Chocolate Thunder during the 2014 King of the Hammers, but he didn't have any trouble reaching the top of the rock climb. The treacherous terrain of Chocolate Thunder will host this year's Vision X ULTRA4 vs. SRRS East/ West Shootout.


