Combat Center hosts MIX-16

The Combat Center hosted Marine Corps Warfighting Laboratory for Marine Air Ground Task Force Integrated Experiment 2016, July 22, as part of Rim of the Pacific Exercise 2016.

The exercise, held July 26 through Aug. 5, tested Company K, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, Company Landing Team's ability to operate in an enemy controlled area with limited resources and capabilities while utilizing future tactics, techniques and procedures. The end goal was to explore the extent to which smaller units will require various assets to remain

"Here at the [MCWL], we test and evaluate future concepts and technologies; ultimately what we are trying to do is determine how we can make the Marine Corps more efficient, more lethal, and more survivable," said Maj. Jason Dempsey, MIX-16 lead project

Civilian role-players brought the exercise to life as they took to Ranges 200 and 215, two Military Operations in Urbanized Terrain facilities, July 25. The role-players simulated a realistic society; possessing its own currency and social structure. The opposition force, played by Company L, 3/5, integrated within the society and played the role of a hybrid asymmetric

"This opposing force is a free-thinking enemy," Dempsey said. "They have free reign of how they attack and when they attack. This is a free-play environment where the enemy can win. It is as realistic as we can make it inside Ranges 200 and 215."

Typically, Marine Corps component commanders task-organize for operations by forming MAGTFs; air-ground, combined-arms formations with logistics support, under a single commander. The exercise evaluates the ability to form mission-specific MAGTFs, utilizing a building-block approach, drawing units and capabilities in numbers as required, creating a force that is uniquely tailored for a situation yet still consistent with combined-arms doctrine.

We're on our way, keeping the great capabilities of the MAGTF, and at the same time making it a little bit different," said Commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. Robert B. Neller. "It's changing right now in front of our eyes."


These smaller, more distributable MAGTFs enable units to operate with a smaller footprint and engage forward in a greater variety of locations than would be possible with a traditional MAGTF.

"There are some capabilities that we have focused on for the past 15 years that I think need to be redirected to prepare for the next conflict," Neller said. "The way I see it, you have two choices – do nothing, or try to get better."

WHAT I'VE LEARNED

Charles Atlanta, GA., Sergeant major, 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines, 7th Marine Regiment MCDEW

>I'm originally from Atlanta, Ga. I had nine aunts and uncles, and there were five of us, brothers and sisters. I had a good family. We didn't have a whole lot of money but we had a whole lot of love.

>Atlanta was kind of rough. I went to a school where you had to learn how to take care of yourself.

>Growing up, I played sports and was in the band for a little bit. After high school, I took a break and spent some time as a truck driver. I met my wife through a mutual friend and after we had our first daughter we decided "let's do something different."

>I didn't know a lot about the military, but when I walked in to the Marine Corps' recruiting office and I looked over and saw that recruiter I thought, "well hell, if I'm going to be somebody I guess I'm going to be one of them." It turns out I made a good choice.

>My first four years were kind of rough. I never intended to be here this long but, like I did my wife, I fell in love with it and I've been here ever since.

>I think the one thing that keeps me driving is when I look at my kids and all they can say is "we're so proud of you." I know in 30 years I have to go home, that's what my wife and I agreed on, but they make me want to stay for 35 or 40 years.

>I have three girls. One is 26 years old, one is 18, one is 13 and then my grandson, he'll be 5 in September. My oldest daughter is married and she promised me, I made all my daughters promise me, that when they get married they have to keep my last name, too.

>As a man, I wanted a son to carry my last name and now I have my grandson. He's just a little man, he wants to do everything I do. He's the other heartbeat of what I am.

>I didn't think things in the Marine Corps would pan out this way. I think every rank after corporal was a blessing. I had a lot of people who invested in me and it would have been impossible for me to have done any of this by myself.

>I'm a big supporter of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Young Marines Program.

> know for a fact that if it weren't for the sacrifices of our veterans, it wouldn't be possible today for us to do what we do. I invest in the younger people so that when I hang up my uniform for good, I leave the Marine Corps with a good product. I can't do that overnight; it takes time and discipline so it's good for me to interact with both sides of the playing field.

> spend a lot of time at the Wood Hobby Shop. I also like to work on cars and tinker with stuff. If it's broken I like to try and fix it, I don't care what it is.

>lt's almost the same way I look at Marines. People say we have broken.

> liken it to restoring a car. When you first look at it, all people see is a hunk of metal. But if you take time to invest in that car and put some love and time into it, it will turn out beautiful. Same thing with the Marines; if you take some time with them and try to figure out what the problem is you'll learn things and be able to help them but you have to be genuine

>After I do my 30 years, I want to take it easy, build myself a house near the lake so I can fish, watch my kids finish growing and spoil my






At the conclusion of the ceremony, Brunner retired and was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal for his selfless dedication to duty.



Montford Point Marines honored with memorial

MARINE CORPS BASE CAMP LEJEUNE, NC - Montford Point, North Carolina. This was segregated training ground from 1942 to 1949 for the nation's first African-American Marines. Now, a new memorial stands outside the gates of Camp Johnson to commemorate their historic achievements in the face of racial segregation.

Hundreds of Montford Point Marines, family members, active duty service members and supporters gathered to witness the official dedication of the National Montford Point Marine Memorial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, July 29.

"Today, as a result of the hard work and perseverance of so many of you here, across the country and those no longer with us, that vision is now a reality," said Brig. Gen. Thomas D. Weidley, commanding general of Marine Corps Installations East – Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune. "This inspiring memorial takes its rightful place among the other silent testimonials to the courage, dedication and sacrifice of our men and women who have worn the cloth of this nation."

In the center of the grounds, a bronze 15-foot statue represents those African-American Marines who left behind combat support duties in the Marine Corps

to pick up a rifle to be a part of the main effort along with their counterparts.

Behind the statue stands the 90-mm M1A1 anti-aircraft gun, the primary anti-aircraft weapon of the Montford Point Marines with the 51st and 52nd Defense Battalions.

To the statue's left is a marble wall with 20,000 stars to honor the approximate number of African American Marines who trained there before they were integrated. No official records were kept at the time to

"This is something that I never thought would be possible," said Ivor Griffin, Montford Point Marine who served 23 years enlisted. "I heard about it being in the making, and I thought it couldn't be true, I thought we were the forgotten 20,000."

Smiles and tears shown on the faces of these aged Marines each time a new speaker came to the podium and recounted the history of what these men had done, and on more than one occasion, they gave motivated shouts of encouragement; this was their day.

"I'm very thrilled to be here and very thrilled knowing that we will be remembered," said Griffin. "[There are] only about 400 of us living, but those of us who are able to be here, we are grateful for what has happened here today, and what has happened in



Twentynine Palms is renowned for its sweltering temperatures as summer reaches its peak. During this time of year, Combat Center residents find ways to keep cool and stay active in the rising temperatures.

Whether its children enjoying their summer vacation or Marines looking for a way to cool off while on liberty, escape from the heat can be found at the various swimming facilities on base. Swimming offers a great aerobic workout and is an exercise that challenges the swimmer, by requiring the use of the whole body.

"In the pool, you can get more of a muscle workout," said Staff Sgt. Theodore C. Hutchins, aquatic staff non-commissioned officer in charge, Marine Corps Communication-Electronics School. "In the water, you are working more muscles than you would at the gym focusing on only one muscle in the same amount of time."

Learning to swim is something that can be done at any age or fitness level. Lifeguards assist in swimming clinics held at the training tank for children learning how to swim or Marines who may need help with their stroke.

"Hydration is the biggest key as well as sunblock to stay safe during the summer. Wearing shirts or anything to protect you from the sun is important."

"The most important thing is becoming comfortable in the water," Hutchins said. "Young Marines who need help swimming can come to the lifeguards to try to strengthen their swimming. We also have time reserved for unit training, so if company or platoon commanders want to come in and schedule training for their Marines they can."

For swimmers who already have the basics down, different drills can be found online that will help them to further develop their swimming. Investing in equipment such as a snorkel, paddle and fins can also help to bring training to the next level.

"As lifeguards we offer different training courses and water sports for those looking to improve their swimming," Hutchins said. "A lot of the time, its people who don't understand their swimming limits or capabilities that are most at risk in the water."

Safety in the water should be the priority at all times and patrons should never swim alone without lifeguards. Sunblock and proper hydration are paramount and should be stressed even on cooler days with less

"Hydration is the biggest key as well as sunblock to stay safe during the summer. Wearing shirts or anything to protect you from the sun is important," Hutchins said. "Often swimmers will come out here thinking they'll be really good but sometimes it's the opposite and they are really struggling. It's up to us lifeguards to ensure we keep our eyes on them."

Regardless of an individual's swimming ability, a trip to the base pool can be a refreshing and effective way to stay cool and fit during the hottest time of year.

Quite a lot, it turns out!

In a Manhattan high-rise, we're quickly introduced to Max, a well-groomed Jack Russell terrier (voiced by Louis C.K.); Chloe, the tubby tabby cat next door (Lake Bell); and Gidget (Jenny Slate), a prissy puffball of a Pomeranian down the street who has a crush on Max.

Max's walking buddies include Buddy, slinky dachshund (Hannibal Burress), and Mel, a squirrel-obsessed pug (Bobby Moynihan).

Things are sailing along fine for Max until his owner brings home a second pet, a big, slobbery, rescue-dog mongrel named Duke (Eric Stonestreet). Max and Duke don't get along, and soon they're in a real doggie delimma, rounded up by Animal Rescue without their collars or tags-and about to begin an even bigger, wilder adven-

This involves even more colorful characters,

including a Snowball, a gonzo white rabbit (Kevin Hart), leader of an underground activist group called the Flushed Pets—animals who've been "thrown away by our owners; now we're out for revenge!" There's Tiberius, a rooftop hawk (Albert Brooks) comically torn between his longing for companionship and hard-wired predatory instincts. Pops (Dana Carvey), an elderly basset hound, may be paralyzed in his back legs—but he sure knows how to get around town!


Director Chris Renauld, whose resume includes the Despicable Me franchise and The Lorax, and co-director Yarrow Cheney, a former production designer and animator,

keep the jokes flying fast and funny and the plot moving at a brisk, lively trot as Max and Duke try to make their way home. Things get especially hairy when Snowball's subterranean army—a motley crew of critters, from alligators, turtles and snakes to cats, a tattooed pig and "Sea Monkeys"—turns against them when they find out they're really "domesticated" and not truly "liberated."

There's a chaotic traffic-jam cliffhanger on a New York City bridge, with a bus driven by a Max and Snowball ("You drive like an animal!"). In one dream sequence, hot dogs dance to "We Go Together," the "rama lama lama ding dong" song from Grease. A poodle rocks out to heavy metal the second his owner is out the door. One tiny pooch, with a camera atop his head, films funny cat videos and uploads then to a Times Square jum-

It's all great, clever, whimsical fun, with a heartwarming, cuddly overlay of friendship and "family." You may not (or may!) have a dog or cat as adventurous as Max, Duke, Gidget, Chloe, Buddy and Mel, but just about anyone can relate to the montage at the end of the movie-when all the pets exuberantly welcome their owners home to the tune of Al Green's "Lovely Day."

Any pet owner knows, and it's no secret: That display of loyalty, love and affection from a pet—no matter where they've been or what they've done-makes it a positively lovely day, indeed.
