

Battle Color Detachment performs at Combat Center

The U.S. Marine Corps Battle Color Detachment performed during a Battle Color Ceremony at Lance Cpl. Torrey L. Gray Field, Wednesday.

The Battle Color Detachment, which is comprised of the U.S. Marine Drum & Bugle Corps, Color Guard and the Silent Drill Platoon, celebrates the historic pride of the Marine Corps through music and ceremonial drill. Each year, these Marines travel worldwide to demonstrate the discipline and “Esprit de Corps” of Marines.

“I absolutely love performing in front of people. It’s one of the best things that we can go out there to do,” said Cpl. Megan Almojuela, member, Drum & Bugle Corps. “We shed a positive light on the Marine Corps and it gives us a really good opportunity to influence young lives and to bring a sense of entertainment, joy and perspective of what the Marine Corps has to offer to the community.”

The ceremony opened with a performance by the Drum & Bugle Corps following renditions of contemporary songs and traditional marching music played by “The Commandant’s Own.” As traditional buglers, they are part of the time-honored tradition of performing daily bugle calls along with standard “honors” for fallen comrades.

Following the performance, the Silent Drill Platoon took to the field with perfect synchronization between the 24 riflemen. Each Marine carried a hand-polished, 10 1/2-pound, M-1 Garand rifle with fixed bayonets. During the ceremony, the

Matthew Marines test new M-14 Rifle over 'A' course

San Diego Calif. — Crack Marine riflemen at the Marine Corps recruit depot are currently testing the Army's new m-14 rifle designed to fire the 7.62mm NATO cartridge.

Master shooters with corps marksmanship training unit (MTU) at the camp Matthews weapons training center are utilizing five of the new rifles, on loan from the army, to determine suitability of the corps' present M-1 rifle qualification course "A" for use in marksmanship training with the m-14.

Extensive tests

The Marines have not yet accepted the new rifle but are putting it through extensive test at Quantico, Va., and elsewhere, including camp Matthews. Current test include the issuing of about 40 rifles for "troop" testing whereby the regular rifleman will carry, fire, clean and handle the weapon, just as he has been doing with the standard M-1. MTU expert shooters who have fired the M-14 generally like the weapon, according to Capt. C. G. Tryon, officer in charge of

the testing group.

He indicated that although the rifle has been fired over the present "A" course only a few times so far, most qualification scores have been slightly higher than average.

Most Marines testing the M-14 at Camp Matthews have experienced no difficulty in firing from the established prone, sitting, kneeling and offhand shooting positions. Some of the master rifleman find they have not been shooting quite as good scored offhand with the new rifle as they do with the M-1.

Lighter Barrel

In the lighter barrel version, the 7.62 (caliber .30) rifle designation the M-14, weighs 8.7 pounds. It does the work of the carbine, M-1 and the submachine gun.

When the new rifle is equipped with the heavier barrel and tripod, it is called the M-15, weighs 13 pounds, replaces the present 20 round Browning Automatic Rifle.

The Army anticipates quantity production of both weapons in 1960.



Silent Drill team performed the drill movements without the use of commands.

"The precision that the Marines on this field have, both the Drum & Bugle Corps and the Silent Drill Team, is tremendously impressive," said Brig. Gen. William F. Mullen III, Combat Center Commanding General. "To me it's representative of what Marines are capable of doing given the right environment."

The Marine Corps Color Guard, which consists of two Marines flanked by two rifle-

men, marched onto the field and presented the National and Marine Corps Color. The 54 streamers and silver bands displayed on the battle color commemorate the military campaigns in which Marines have participated. They span the entire history of the nation, from the American Revolution to the present.

The ceremony concluded with the pass in review and the Battle Color Detachment being dismissed. Afterward, the detachment remained on the field to interact with spectators.
