Combat Center to train elite fighting force with LSE-17

Since its inception in 1952, the Combat Center's mission has been to effectively train Marines to become a more lethal and effective fighting force. From August 11 – August 25, 2017, the Combat Center will host a two week-long Large Scale Exercise. The highly-specialized and diverse situations presented by this training combine up to three infantry battalions with aircraft support, ground troops and live-fire.

In order to adhere to the Marine Corps' current and progressive service-level training requirements, the Combat Center must provide ample space for Marines to train for real-life scenarios in an LSE training environment. Through regulated training, conducted in realistic environments, under realistic circumstances, the Corps ensures that its forces maintain the highest levels of proficiency and readiness for worldwide deploy-

LSE is an assessed Marine Air Ground Task Force exercise focused at the Marine Expeditionary Brigade level and composed of all four elements of the Marine Air Ground Task Force with live, virtual and constructive elements. It is designed to challenge commands across the spectrum of the MAGTF and will focus on improving the warfight-

ing skills of senior commanders and their staffs, develop a common understanding of MAGTF doctrine and enhance the capabilities within a joint and combined operating environment with appropriate exercise control and training.

For the fifth iteration of LSE, 2nd Marine Division will act as the command element and lead more

than 4,500 Marines and sailors with II Marine Expeditionary Force. Participants of LSE-17 include a composition of forces from 2nd MarDiv, Regimental Combat Team-8, 2nd Marine Logistics Group, 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing and II MEF Information Group.

Combat Center to utilize TSUA during LSE 17

Since World War II, the Marine Corps has consistently integrated the elements of air, ground, and sea into their combat operations, to create a three-dimensional joint fighting force, unique only to the Corps.

the Federal Aviation Administration, temporary special use airspace is airspace that is designed and activated for special events, for a specific period of time.

"Operating in special use airspace, permanent or temporary, adds a level of safety by completely segregating military air-

With the expanding capabilities of Marine aircraft and artillery over the last several decades, it became necessary for the Marine Corps to obtain additional land and airspace in order to adequately train Marines with advancing technology in realistic combat scenarios. The National Defense Authorization Act of 2014 was signed into law, changing the boundaries between the Combat Center and the Bureau of Land Management. The establishment of special use airspace over and adjacent to the newly acquired lands allows Marines to train like they fight as an integrated Marine Air round Task Force.

"Special use airspace is where activities otherwise hazardous to non-participating aircraft can be accomplished," said Lt. Col. Jeffrey Meeker, regional airspace coordinator, Marine Corps Installation West.

Similar to SUA, temporary special use airspace allows Marines and the military aircrafts they use to operate in a more realistic training environment, under the military air controllers, as a part of the MAGTF.

According to Meeker, who coordinates and oversees new and existing airspace in cooperation with craft from non-participating aircraft," said Meeker. "We have restricted areas and also inform the public aviation community that military flight operations are occurring in a specific area."

The TSUA is able to effectively segregate hazardous military training from the local aviation community, whether it be from ground-based live fire or aviation activities. The increased awareness of segregation supports a safer environment for both civilian and military aviation professionals.

According to Meeker, Civilian pilots are informed of SUA conditions through a variety of methods; public outreach targeting airfields within a 100 nautical mile radius of the intended airspace through mass-emailing via the FAA, daily entries in the Notices to Airmen publication, daily NO-TAMs during the exercise and the MCAGCC website.

The Combat Center's usage of the TSUA is essential to the training of the MAGTF. For more information on the Shared Use Area or TSUA visit www.29palms.marines.mil, under the G5 Government and External Affairs tab and select airspace.

Escape artist does the trick

"If I'm not out in a minute and a half, you better start worrying,"explained Dennis "Houdenny" Pisciotta, of HqBn, over the sound of clanging steel as his wrists were being secured with five sets of handcuffs and his ankles bound by leg shackles.

Pisciotta, who has been getting out of tight spots since he was five years old, boasts of never failing on an escape attempt and, after his most recent stunt at the training tank August 7, he can still make that claim.

Actually the 20-year-old escape artist had more trouble with the red tape than he did with the handcuffs. It took nearly three months to get all the required approval for the

"DAWN" (Desert August Water Number) escape feat from people with safety in

"Now I'm shaking," he said as he lowered himself into the 77 degree water where he was then led to the center of the pool by two men. They resembled tug boats escorting a ship from the harbor as they struggled to keep Pisciotta's head above water while the weighted vest and steel chains and cuffs tried to drag him under.

Pisciotta sucked in a deep breath then disappeared under water on his way to the bottom, 17 feet below. The surface was blurred with the spray of a hose to prevent curious spectators from seeing how the escape was made.

As the seconds ticked away

on the pace clock, all eyes were glued to a blue and white floater in anticipation of a distress signal. The floater was attached to Pisciotta's weighted vest by a long nylon rope and if the escape artist was in trouble he would tug twice on the rope to signal rescuers.

After one minute had passed, the floater began to bob up and down, alarming the crowd and sending rescuers on their way.

As rescuers went under, Pisciotta emerged at the side of the pool. His hands were free as the cuffs dangled from only one wrist but his ankles were still bound by shackles.

"I'm not used to this temperature," Pisciotta explained. He had practiced the act five times during the week and the water temperature averaged 83 degrees, so the 77 degree water was unusually cold.

"It's cold and I hurt," he added. "These weights are putting pressure on me and the colder water makes it harder to hold my breath.

Another reason he had trouble with the first attempt according to Pisciotta was, "I couldn't get a good breath with the two assistants bouncing me up and down as they towed me to the middle of the pool, so I will try again without any help."

After about ten minutes Pisciotta was ready to go again. The handcuffs were locked in place and he lowered himself from the side of the pool.

One assistant sprayed the surface while another kicked the water so no one could see but all wondered if he would make it this time.

"One minute now," someone shouted at they watched the clock. "One-fifteen," the voice informed again. After a minute and a half, Pisciotta's head popped up out of the water. The attempt was successful and the crown applauded. The question, "how did he do that," seemed to be on everyone's mind and written in their puzzled expressions.

"I felt a lot better the second time," Pisciotta said with a smile. Everybody felt better when the life guard signaled that the pool was now open, the act was over and the patient crowd enjoyed the water without any chains.




WHAT I'VE LEARNED

Braham, Minnesota lance corporal, PMO, 22

LANCE CPL. KYLE RAMTHUN, PMO, VISITS DIFFERENT SCHOOLS EVERY YEAR TO TEACH CHILDREN ABOUT D.A.R.E., WHICH STANDS FOR DRUG ABUSE RESISTANCE AND EDUCATION. HE EXPLAINS THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF DRUGS AND THEIR EFFECTS ON THE BODY AND MIND.

- > I grew up in Braham, Minn.; it was a small town with a community atmosphere; everyone got along. I had the opportunity to go to the basketball state tournament.
- > Playing basketball allowed me to go to many different places as a teenager. I also played football, but I wasn't as good at it as I was at basketball.
- > I lived with my mom, my stepdad, Brian, and my four brothers. My oldest brother is Dean; my second oldest is David, who is in the medical field; my third oldest is Daniel, who served in the Marine Corps; my youngest brother, Dylan, is a sophomore in high school.
- **> My role model** is my mom. She is my best friend and the one I always look up to. I always stuck to her hip as a kid until I joined the Marine Corps.
- > I joined the Marine Corps because I saw the joy it brought my brother. It is the best decision I've ever made. When I was recruited, Provost Marshals Office was my first choice for my [military occupational specialty]. If I could choose my MOS again I would definitely choose to work in PMO.
- > I work in Physical Security for PMO. What that means is that I handle anything that involves the protection of the assets that are within this installation.
- > I'm a D.A.R.E. teacher, which means that I teach kids about drugs.

- > D.A.R.E. stands for Drug Abuse Resistance and Education. The D.A.R.E. program is a ten-week program in which I go to a school and I give the kids a total of ten lessons.
- > I teach first through seventh grade. After the lessons, they have to write an essay about what they learned in order to graduate. I've read some of the kid's essays and a lot of them learn a great deal from my lessons. Sometimes kids come up and thank me for teaching them about drug abuse and its negative effects.
- > I've been going to school using tuition assistance. I'm working toward a degree in business management and marketing. After the Marine Corps, I'm thinking of going to work for a homeland security business. After I get enough money, I want to be able to start my own business.
- > Advice I would give to junior Marines is that 'knowledge is power', be it in or out of the Marine Corps. You can use tuitions assistance to get a degree while in the Marine Corps so that when you are out, you can start up your own business or work for a company that you always wanted to work for.
- > The thing I will miss the most about the Marine Corps is the people. By facing adversity and good times together we are able to build camaraderie that will never falter; you won't find that kind of brotherhood anywhere else.



'America's Battalion' attends training at MCMWTC

MARINE **CORPS** MOUNTAIN WARFARE TRAINING CENTER, Bridgeport, Calif., - Infantrymen with 2nd Battalion, 8th Marine Regiment, based out of Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, N.C., participated in Assault Climber's Course as part of Mountain Training Exercise 4-17 August 1, 2017 aboard Marine Corps Mountain Warfare Training Center, Bridgeport.


MTX is a service level training exercise focused on missions in a complex environment. Marines learn how to maneuver in high altitude, mountainous and cold weather environments, which better prepares them to provide support to their parent units. ACC contains the following three phases: Mountain endurance exam, knots and rope systems and free climbing on cliff faces.

Throughout the five-week MTX, Marines take part in four evolutions, which include a river crossing with a single rope bridge, cliff assaults, rappelling and movements to contact. The culminating event combines all four evolutions during a night climb exercise.

"It's great to showcase what we are capable of as Marines, not only out in the training area but while forward deployed," said Capt. Brandon Bocian, commander of company G, 2/8. "Coming to [MCMWTC] benefits the Marine Corps because we have an opportunity to train in terrain that we might encounter in country."

The incorporation of regional, joint and service-level training in MTX provides the tactical integration of a MAGTF, which consists of a ground combat element with one task organized maneuver battalion, a limited aviation combat element, and a logistics combat element comprised of a combat logistics detachment. During the exercise, 2/8 received the opportunity to implement tactics as the GCE of the MAGTF.


"The course was very challenging," said Cpl. Ryan Boswell, squad leader, 2/8. "I've learned a lot about my abilities as a Marine and overall I think it was a great learning experience that enhances the readiness of my Marines and our unit."

As a multi-lateral training exercise, this evolution also includes elements from the 5th Canadian Mechanized Brigade Group, the 3rd Commando Brigade from Great Britain and the 6th Light Armoured Brigade from France.

Combined, these forces will conduct long-range raids, casualty evacuations, live-fire events, defensive operations, cyber and electronic warfare, information operations, close-air support, and simulated combat operations that will increase the efficiency and effectiveness of 2nd MarDiv and, in turn, the Marine Corps when called upon to organize, deploy and employ military forces as part of a joint, coalition force.

The Marine Corps will utilize 164,000 acres of newly-acquired land, 107,000 of which were designated as exclusive for military use year round. The closure period will include

the time required to ensure the SUA is clear of recreation activity prior to training and to confirm the land is clear of hazards such as unexploded ordnance and debris prior to reopening the land for public access.

The adjacent Johnson Valley Off Highway Vehicle Recreation Area will remain open to the public during the closure of the SUA and the Corps will continue to implement robust public outreach to ensure the public is informed of the temporary change in land use.

In addition to proper clearing of the land prior to and following the LSE, the Marine Corps has announced the next planned use of the SUA for military training in 2018 from August 1-30, honoring the commitment to provide a minimum of 12 months advance notice to the public of training in the SUA



Shadow Mountain Branch Library hosts tech lab for children

The Combat Center's Shadow Mountain Branch Library hosted a technical seminar called Space Maker Lab that allows children of military families from Tuesday through Thursday to learn how to develop application programs for mobile devices.

Shadow Mountain Branch Library, located in bldg. 692, is new to the Combat Center community and conducted the class to help foster excitement about the future of technology in children from military parents and open their minds to positive opportunities.

The three-day-long class is taught to school-aged children who know how to use an e-mail account. The average age of participants is 13 to 15 years old.

During the class, students learn about computer operations, programming and how to create applications. To graduate, students must receive a passing grade on the tests they took throughout the course and upload an app they created to the Google store.

"The idea is to spark innovation and get the children interested in science," said Maj. Terry Traylor, commander, Fardgo, N.D. U.S. Military Entrance Processing Command. "Children are able to come to [the Combat Center] and learn to cope, lead and build apps."

Marine Corps Community Services is the primary sponsor for the lab, but it is also supported by students at the Marine Corps Communication-Electronics School here and the Fabrication Laboratory.

"With the help of our sponsors, we are able to offer a hands-on class and get children closer to the device," Traylor said.


The students are able to create applications which give them full authority over their final product and can be used as a recreational tool for their age group.

"I'm excited to graduate tomorrow," said Bryce Gussman, student, MSL. "It's fun and I'd recommend it to other kids."




