

## **2nd LAAM's Detachment** returns after Atlantic **Fleet Exercise**

The island of Vieques off Puerto Rico was the objective area for an amphibious training assault exercise, involving 40,000 Navy men and Marines aboard every type of ship in the Atlantic fleet.

The Detachment from Second Light Antiaircraft Missile Battalion participated in the maneuvers and according to Capt. R. W. Fischer, officer in charge of the 2nd LAAM detachment and Capt. J. R. Harman, commanding officer of B Battery, it was successful in training and proved the operational capabilities of the HAWK system operating in conjunction with Marine Air Control Squadron-8, from New River, North Carolina.

It was stated by Lt. Col. E. L. Barker, commanding officer of MACS-8, that operations held with the HAWK personnel integrated with MACS-8 was successful in every respect. During the first few days it was a little rough getting oriented but towards the end of the operations the units worked smoothly in tracking and performance in the bubble was outstanding.

The completion of the predatory operations by Navy ships and units was coincided with the arrival of the task fleet and its main landing force of more than 10,000 Marines of the Second Marine Expeditionary Force commanded by Lt. Gen. Robert B. Luckey. The task fleet commander in charge of LantPhiBex was

Vice Admiral Alfred G. Ward, who directed the amphibious exercise from his flagship, USS Poncho.

Lt. Gen. Luckey, Maj. Gen. Richard C. Mangrum, Col. W. Hausman, chief of staff FMF Lant, and Col. W. M. Lundin, commanding officer of Marine Air Group 32, visited the 2nd LAAM detachment at their location and were briefed on the capabilities of the HAWK weapon by Capt. Harman. They also received a tour of the equipment during the operations.

The Atlantic and Caribbean maneuvers designed to give amphibious striking force realistic training and further sharpen combat efficiency concluded on April 30. Personnel of the 2nd LAAM detachment received excellent training during the exercises since they were able to make splashes on bogie runs after being passed to the Battery by MACS-8 controllers.

The unit's mission was to operate with MACS-8 in an integrated tactical air operations center and to give a tour and briefing for visiting personnel was highly successful, according to Capt. R. W. Fischer and Capt. J. R. Harman.

Armed Forces Press Service revealed that the first Marine Corps Reserves conducted their annual field training at Vieques maneuvers and this was also another first in the training of reserves outside the continental of the United States.



# **Lost & Found Guidelines**

It happens from time to time; a Marine returns from unit physical training only to realize they left their wallet or ID at the track. What should they do when they return to find their item missing?

Fortunately, the Provost Marshal's Office offers a Lost and Found program for Combat Center personnel, residents and guests who have lost an important item or are trying to return valuable property to its owner.

It is important for person-

nel to know that the Lost and Found is here and they can drop off missing valuables with the Desk Sergeant. Those same items can be retrieved from the Physical Security department. For those turning in items, the Desk Sergeant is present 24/7 in bldg. 1407. For those looking to reclaim a lost object, Physical Security is available Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The majority of items turned into our office are credit/debit cards, driver licenses, wallets,

meal cards and even room kevs. Occasionally, items such as jewelry and electronics are turned into our office, but may be damaged or even inoperable. Additionally, Marine Corps Community Services and the Commissary turns over Lost and Found items on a monthly basis.

If you see something missing and don't know what to do with it, please turn it into the Desk Sergeant. Items that will not be accepted are the following: clothing, disposable objects, and anything considered to be of no value. Weapons and knives are turned into the Criminal Investigation Division for screening and then are disposed of properly.

The process for claiming an item(s) simply requires the owner to describe in detail any distinguishing markings or features. Showing a picture ID or marking the item with a name and contact information can accelerate the process for reclaiming property.

\*Note: Any Common Access Cards (CAC) that are turned in are immediately submitted to the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) office in bldg. 1551. Any items that are not reclaimed within 45 days of receipt will be disposed of properly, so be sure to contact us as soon as possible.

chemical agent is prohibited aboard base unless specifically authorized.

Weapons may be permitted on base if they are registered with PMO. The term weapon includes firearms, air guns, BB guns, knives with a blade longer than 4 inches, martial arts weapons, and bows and arrows. The weapon does not need to be present in order to register it aboard base however, documentation depicting ownership is required.

To register a weapon, visit the Visitor Center at bldg. 901 or call 760-830-6794. Weapons can be registered anytime Monday - Friday from 5:30 a.m. - 9 p.m. Appointments can be scheduled Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. For any Command Access Card holders, you can request SharePoint access to register online at http://www.29palms.







partook in the course.

According to Chief Warrant Officer 3 Michael Skinta, gunner, MTU, the participants shot on ranges varying from 100 to 1000 yards and shot at moving robotic targets to simulate the speeds and directions at which individuals would move in combat situations.

"The purpose of running sniper packages is to make each shooter faster and more lethal on his first round of engagement and increase their survivability on the battlefield," Skinta said.

The course of fire during this training iteration was designed to increase the lethality of each shooter through conducting diverse drills. The shooters took part in a variety of drills throughout the four day course, starting with the basic FBI sniper qualification. This tests the shooter's ability to conduct a cold bore shot, which impacts their target in the desired area the first time the shooter fires.

"This is extremely important for law enforcement," Skinta said. "If they pull the trigger, they need to hit what they are aiming at on the first shot. "


The shooters also partook in color dot drills which helps them improve their speed. In addition, participants performed various drills in multiple shooting positions behind different barriers. According to Skinta, this tests shooter's skills in alternate shooting positions and puts a little competition into the shooting, which normally pushes the shooters to perform a little better.

"We are scoring every shot so they can see where they came in at and where they are when they leave," Skinta said. "Hopefully at the end of the four days they will all leave faster and more accurate and have a little more appreciation for the Hi-Desert."



# City of Twentynine Palms hosts 4th Annual Park-2-Park Bike Ride

The trail included a 3,000 ft. climb in elevation, and challenged its riders by the constant and steady incline, flattening halfway through with high wind resistance. For the families of those taking part in the main challenge that Park-2-Park has been known for, there was the Family Fun Ride which was a less-intense 7-mile ride at a later time, and a Bike Rodeo for the younger children.


"Park-2-Park is an important event because it gets families out to enjoy Earth Day," said Randy Councell, community service director, City of Twentynine Palms. "The event has a lot of new additions this year to incorporate the rider's families. The city of Twentynine Palms is doing a lot to bring the community together, and we're always looking for ways to further that goal."

Though the ride itself was difficult, its participants expressed how rewarding it was to finish the race.

"I've been training for this for the past six months, and it's still tough," said Rick Lamelin, retired sergeant major. "You're going as fast as you can for more than 50 miles, and the first half is this insane incline, then the second half levels out into flat plains with intense winds. It's well worth it when you finish."

Many were return-participants, enjoying the ride for the reasons it exists.

"This is my third year participating," said Staff Sgt. Berek Krehmeier, communication maintenance chief, Communication Logistics Battalion 7. "I love coming out here and doing this because I get to hang out with my friends and family and see the city operate. It's a good time spent every year."


